Pastor's Pen

A Fresh Start

"...forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." Philippians 3:13-14

As the calendar turns from December to January we are often filled with gladness that one year is past, and the eager hope of a new year unfolding before us. With the new year, perhaps we hunger for a new beginning...to grow areas where we are weak, to move ahead where we have been dragging, to increase what has been deminishing. To grow, especially in one's love for and trust in Christ is a most noble desire and one worth reflecting upon.

Resolution is the word most often associated with the start of a new year. Consider some of the meanings of "resolution":

- 1) The process of reducing or breaking something down to a simpler form (as in an idea, a machine, or a substance),
 2) A formal expression of the opinion or will of an assembly, often by vote,
- 3) The moving of one's voice or an instrumental tone into the same musical
- chord (as in harmonizing), 4) To solve (as in a mathematical equation)
- 5) A fixed purpose; firmness; determination

For some this may begin to feel a bit trivial, but the love of studying words and finding its true meaning in our everyday conversation is not lost on me. With this in mind, the last definition seems to fit best what we mean when we make a New Year's resolution. We make a decision of the will; we determine within ourselves to accomplish something, to improve something about ourselves, or replace a bad habit with one that is much better.

I must admit that these resolutions have never been a big priority in my life. It occurs to me that the realist (or skeptic) in me always knew that I would never be able to accomplish my resolution goal. But does that make our resolutions a waste of time? Emphatically NO!, especially when we have our priorities in the right place.

As the New Year is upon us let us make the resolution to draw closer to God. He loves us with an immeasurable love. He sticks close to us throughout our ups and downs, and even in the midst of our wandering love for Him. Let us resolve to make the reading and study of His word, the Bible, a priority in our lives this year. Let us determine to let God have His way in our lives, to discover His will, to grow in His love, and to share His Good News with those around us. Let us determine to have God mold us into the image of His Son, Jesus Christ.

The New Year is a great time to take stock of our life. It is also a great time of year to get reconnected to those things that are most important to us. May we make God our highest priority in the year to come. And who knows, God may just do some unexpected and amazing things in and through our church family. May God bless you with a grace-filled year in 2015.

The Women of the church wish, once again, to thank each of you that provided delicious Christmas cookies, cakes, breads and candies for the recent Christmas Bake & Craft Sale. Equally, huge thanks to those that made some incredible gift items! David Douglas, Bill Hambleton and Larry Ogle tied for having the best crafts contributed by the men of the church! All of you fellows that helped with table set-up and take down, you are our heroes, and we appreciate you so much!

The final report for funds raised was \$3,740. Isn't that wonderful?!

We sold out of all baked goods before closing time – leaving some of our guests quite sad. Our event is incredibly popular in the area, with people marking their calendars a year in advance to attend because the quality of the baked goods is comparable to, no, better than one can purchase at a bakery!

Here at Trinity, the hearts of our women are enormous, yet we cannot fulfill the needs among the community to mend broken bodies or injured souls. So we pull together our talents to make things from which we can earn the money to support charities that can help with mending and healing. That is one reason we hold the Christmas Bake & Craft Sale. annually.

Lifehouse Maternity Home is one ministry we support with our funds. As its name implies it is a refuge where young women can find help with an unexpected pregnancy. House moms and other young mothers live together to learn parenting skills while pursuing education and employment goals. They share housekeeping and cooking chores too.

Kelly, in her early twenties, says "Lifehouse is a place that I can call home, it is not just a house." She is now the mother of a baby boy. In addition to the practical needs being met, she benefits on the spiritual side too, as the young women have Bible studies during the week and daily devotionals. It took Kelly some time to adjust to the flurry of activity when she first arrived, but she has found that she gets back what she puts into it, and found it important not to 'sweat the small stuff'. "I was surprised at the profound love and level of happiness my son brings." She summarizes what has made Lifehouse so special to her and her son -- structure, support, stability and encouragement.

It is wonderful to help young women like Kelly, to watch these new families grow. For those of you that contributed items to sell and volunteered at our December event, you are now contributing to the good work by ministries such as Lifehouse. Thank you again.

Changing the subject, Pastor Steve led the Tuesday Morning Circle lesson in December, and has agreed to facilitate our Bible studies through the school year! Our next lesson will be 2 Corinthians 5:11 – 6:10 (Lesson 5 in *Reconciling Paul*).
