John 14:3

Minute for mission

Dear Trinity Brothers and Sisters,

Greetings for Matanzas, Cuba. Wow, I cannot believe that it has been eight months since we left Southern California for our PCUSA appointment as mission co-workers assigned to Cuba. What an adventure it has been!

Our departure from Louisville, KY on a very cold 26th of January to arrive to a hot and humid Havana, Cuba was filled with mixed emotions for both of us. The pain of leaving what we have come to know and love behind was very hard. Yet, we looked forward to stretching ourselves and finding new ways of living out our faith in a different context.



Lots has occurred during our almost 5 months here. The first thing we want you all to know is that Church is alive. By "Church" we mean the "Church of Jesus Christ" not only the Reformed-Presbyterian Church in Cuba. Yes, they have many struggles and much to overcome, as we all do in our particular context. Since our arrival David and I have decided to make the Central Presbyterian Church in Matanzas our home church. The church is about a 10-13 minute walk from the Seminary which is a big plus. Pastors Ary and Beidy are a young dynamic husband and wife pastoral team with much to offer to this 100 year old congregation. We have felt very much welcomed and included in their midst. I have come to be included in a jewelry making with the women of the church on Thursday mornings. It is a time of fellowship and prayer. Lots of laughter, as you can imagine.

Our daily living here has been at times challenging. Yet we have come to hold fast to the "Serenity Prayer". One of our biggest challenges has been internet connectivity. Internet is a new and exciting adventure for the Island. The expansion of "wifi" in public parks has been increasing steadily. Yes, there is a cost for use, which is very expensive, yet the public "wifi parks" are full with youth and adults connecting to the outside world. The connectivity is not very reliable nor secure, but once you "catch" the signal one needs to use this time wisely. As I mentioned to Harriet, Skype (and other video social media) is not a possibility at all from Cuba, because of broadband at the moment, this might change once mobile companies make their way into the Cuban Telecommunication market, we shall see.

David and I have been getting to know the seminary students, local pastors and congregations in our immediate area. As for David, he has finished giving his first seminary course: Advance Greek. He has enjoyed returning to the classroom. He looks forward to teaching several New Testament courses come September. Several preaching invitations have been extended and fulfilled. Just today as you read this, David is preaching at the Central Presbyterian Church and I am liturgist for this morning's worship service. Come July and August we will be engaged several church related activities. Josey will be doing some conversational English classes with seminary students, and will be helping with VBS at the Central Presbyterian Church and doing conversational English 2x a week with upper elementary to high school kids. In September, Josey will be teaching a Theological English course for new incoming seminary students.

Please pray for us as we travel to Florida during July 26-August 13 for work. We will be attending a conference in St. Petersburg. It will be good to be back in the States, where we will be able to upgrade all our computer applications, complete our US Taxes (since this cannot be done from Cuba), register to vote, check-in on family and friends and do some necessary shopping for items to take with us once we return. We have been more than blessed to have several PC(USA) groups come through the Seminary and brings us items, like a toilet seat, vitamins, York peppermint patties, mosquito net, over the counter meds, personal items etc. What a blessing to come to know so many people in our beloved PCUSA Church who are out in the world doing God's work in Cuba and in Latin America.

WOW Recipe OF THE MONTH

~Elizabeth Latham

Easy Strawberry Pie (Perfect for Summer)

Makes: 6-8 servings

Ingredients:

9 inch unbaked pastry shell

³/₄ cup sugar

2 tablespoons cornstarch

1 cup of water

1 package (3 ounces) strawberry gelatin

4 cups sliced fresh strawberries

Fresh mint, optional

Directions:

- 1) Bake uncooked pastry shell at 450 degrees for 10 minutes. Cool on a wire rack.
- 2) In a small sauce pan, combine sugar, cornstarch and water until smooth.
- 3) Bring to a boil and cook for 2 minutes until thickened. Remove from the heat and stir in the gelatin until dissolved.
- 4) Refrigerate for 15 minutes or until slightly cooled.
- 5) Arrange strawberries in the crust. Pour gelatin mixture over the berries. Refrigerate until set. Garnish with mint.
