PASTOR'S PEN

The Glorious Harvest of Easter
"So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow."

1 Corinthians 3:7

It probably goes without saying, but planting and harvesting is no easy task. The process is long and requires much blood, sweat, and tears. Yet, we can do everything right and still not be successful at reaping a bountiful harvest. The Scripture above hints at this very fact.

Right now, many of us are beginning the task of the annual Spring cleanup. Sticks and branches from the yard. Weed pulling. Removing those leaves left over from last Fall. We're also probably planning our gardens for the year. What flowers will you plant this year? Will you plant an herb garden? What kinds of vegetables do you intend to plant?

Recall, we can do everything right and still not produce a successful harvest. We may plant, but the seeds may be bad. We may water, but the heat scorches the plants. He prepares our hearts to receive His Word and promise. He plants within us faith in His Son, Jesus Christ. And He alone can cause that faith to bud and blossom into a deep love for God.

Easter is the ultimate seed of hope. As that seed bears much fruit in our lives by the work of God's Holy Spirit, we are compelled to plant that seed in the hearts of others. Easter is the great message of hope. Let us labor about our communities and our city planting that seed in the hearts of our neighbors and coworkers, our friends and enemies. For in due season, God shall bring forth a glorious harvest!



Who: Adult members and friends of Trinity, both couples and singles.


<u>What:</u> Gather to share a meal and conver-sation. The meal can be dinner, lunch, brunch, picnic or whatever works best for the group.







Joyful, Joyful, we adore Thee, God of glory, Lord of love!

We called for help, and you responded!! TPW's December CHRISTMAS SALE success is a testimony of God's devotion to our congregation, and His loving care of all organizations who receive funds from the sale to perform good works! The total sale at this writing is a whopping \$4,939.27. What a blessing indeed!

A total of \$3,200.00 has been distributed to ten charities from our funds. The charities are: Eastern Area Ministries, The Healing Place, Home of the Innocents, House of Ruth, Lifehouse, Louisville Seminary "Bookends", Necole's Place, Salvation Army, Supplies Over Seas, and Wayside Christian Mission.

Also, the sale of scarves from Guatemala sold by members of our congregation on behalf of the Trinity Presbyterian Women **Christmas Sale** generated a total of \$640 for the Pala Village Weavers in Guatemala, plus \$160 for TPW. Many of you saw these scarves at the TPC All Church Birthday event last spring, and have been reading about the improvements in village life being made through this PC/USA missionary project. Dr. Sandra Hollensead wishes to thank all of you for helping her brother, Barney Hale, in the scarf ministry.

The remaining funds will be disbursed later in 2016 as the Lord leads. We continuously receive requests for donations, and making decisions can be hard. We ask for your continued prayers in this responsibility.

A story from the Sale: A lovely woman had selected five pillowcases of Christmas fabrics suitable for her grandchildren — all that we had. But she needed a sixth one for each of her six grandchildren. She asked advice from one of our women volunteers at the sale. The oldest grandchild, a grandson, was in college now, and perhaps did not need a present? The volunteer directed her attention to a small nativity made by a member of the congregation in our Center for Faith and Arts. The nativity might help her son recall his Christian beliefs while at college, she observed, which can be a challenging time for the faithful. The woman agreed and left with gifts for all six of her grandchildren. Although this grandmother and her grandchildren are nameless to us, we can remember them in our prayers throughout this year, as well as other families with growing children.

Again, thank you to all members for the happy memories of the 2015 CHRISTMAS SALE.


