

Strong-armed by a Squirrel "...the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world." 1 John 4:4





Rather than bounding away from our apparent threat, this one stood its ground. Soon, we were being chirped at, fluffed tail flitting about, tiny black eyes piercingly fixed on us. We stood there, suddenly stopped and challenged by a tiny squirrel!

> Taken aback by this brazen breach of wildlife protocol, we stopped, frozen, shocked by this squirrel's defiant display against us. Following a short staring contest, the beast finally relented, climbing the nearby tree, remaining watchful of our every move as we continued on our way.

I must say, that out-sized, out-numbered, out-witted squirrel taught me something. 




MEET SEBASTIAN ...

Sebastian has created art at Trinity's Center for Faith and Art since it began. Now 22, and a graduate of Ballard High School, he can be found most Tuesdays in the Center's studio at the church, taking private lessons from Center Director Candy Wheat. From the clay worked by his hands, he produces dog bowls, vases and wind chimes, all of which he sells. When he isn't creating from clay, he participates in art classes at Jefferson Community College.

How did Sebastian discover his God-given artistic talent? It all began when his mother, Sandra, who had taken pottery classes from Candy, asked if she would present a day camp experience for children with autism. About half a dozen young people came to that first camp -Sebastian among them – and most of those students continue as private students today.

This is a unique mission of Trinity Presbyterian Church and a dream of Candy's. Over the next few months, we will look into the studio as clay is rolled, pounded and pulled; and ceramic creations are glazed and fired.



In addition to a number of classes, the Center holds open studio time on Wednesdays from 10-noon, and private lessons on hand-building and thrown pottery by appointment. To reserve a space or volunteer, call the church office at 245-5515 and ask for Candy.



MISSION TO COLUMBIA

Trinity's Seminary Intern, Ainsley Herrick, has been selected to serve as a Young Adult Volunteer (YAV) during the 2016-17 year through the Presbyterian Church! The YAV program sends over 100 young adults between the ages of 19 and 30 to 23 sites around the United States and the world.



In September, Ainsley will be flying to Colombia to spend 11 months living and working in partnership with the Iglesia Presbiteriana de Colombia (Presbyterian Church of Colombia). She will be living in a Christian community, doing a variety of jobs.

Ainsley was drawn to Colombia after learning about its war and the effect on its people. Despite its natural and cultural wealth, the <u>YAV website</u> notes: "Colombia has also been plagued by conflict for generations, leaving 10% of the population internally displaced, turned into refugees in their own country. Peace talks are underway between the government and the FARC guerrilla group, and implementation of controversial free trade agreements has just begun."

Ainsley does not yet know where she will live or what she will be doing. Possibilities include church -based micro-enterprise and agriculture, urban youth programs, advocacy and accompaniment with displaced communities, community-based peace initiatives, and rural children's programs. Despite her uncertainty, she has strong faith and trust in God that He will lead her where she is needed most.

Please help support Ainsley during her YAV year in Columbia! As part of her commitment, she is required to raise \$4,000 in gifts and pledges for her year of service. One time gifts or pledges are welcome. Or please consider a monthly donation of \$10, \$20, or \$50 a month. Even a small one-time donation makes a difference. She needs to raise \$2,000 by July 1st!

WOW Recipe OF THE MONTH

From the Kitchens of our chefs from Worship on Wednesday (WoW):

Super Easy Parmesan Chicken. Serves 6-8.

Ingredients: 2 to 2.5 lbs. boneless chicken strips

1 jar favorite pasta sauce

1 package sliced provolone cheese Mozzarella and/or parmesan cheese Shake n' Bake original chicken coating

1 box your favorite pasta

Directions:

- 1. Shake n' bake the chicken strips for 10-12 minutes
- 2. Pour 1/2 jar of pasta sauce apiece into 2 casserole bowls
- 3. Arrange baked chicken on top of sauce
- 4. Layer provolone cheese on top of chicken to cover (about 4-5 slices); sprinkle with mozzarella and/or parmesan cheese
- 5. Bake at 350 degrees with lid off for around 30 minutes until cheese starts to brown
- 6. Serve over pasta and Enjoy!
