

The St. John's Bible Introduced to Trinity Presbyterian Church by the Rev. Dr. Ann Laird Jones



The Saint John's Bible is the first completely handwritten and illuminated ("illustrated") Bible officially commissioned since the invention of the printing press.

On January 22nd, we have the privilege to experience this Bible first-hand, as well as learn more about the significance of God's Word represented in this unique and beautiful design.

The Rev. Dr. Ann Laird Jones, an alumnus of Louisville Seminary and an ordained Presbyterian minister, will share with us this exciting rendering of Scripture.

MONTREAT.

The Saint John's Bible is the first completely handwritten and hand-illuminated Bible to have been commissioned by a Benedictine Abbey since the invention of the moveable type printing press in the West printed the Gutenberg Bible in 1455. A 15-year project, the Saint John's Bible was finished in 2011 for St. John's University.

Using the New Revision Standard Version Catholic Edition of the Bible, the Saint John's Bible is divided into seven volumes and is two feet tall by three feet wide when open. The manuscript Bible was made on vellum with 160 hand illuminations.

The Saint John's Bible production was created by six calligraphers and six illuminators who used a variety of artistic genres.

Montreat Conference Center is hosting the heritage edition of the Gospel & Acts version of the Saint John's Bible and will be offering programs for churches, seminaries, and other groups through August 2017. Inquiries should be sent to **stjohnsbible@montreat.org**.
