**All: God requires that His justice be satisfied. Therefore the claims of His justice must be paid in full, either by ourselves or another.**  
Leader: Can we pay this debt ourselves?

Leader: Can another creature—any at all—pay this debt for us?  
**All: No. To begin with, God will not punish another creature for what a human is guilty of. Besides, no mere creature can bear the weight of God’s eternal anger against sin and release others from it.**
