CALL TO WORSHIP: based on Galatians 3:26-29 Tom Dawson
Leader: By faith in Jesus Christ each of us becomes a child of God. Through our baptism in Jesus Christ we dressed in His righteousness.

* **CONFESSING OUR FAITH:** The Heidelberg Catechism – Day 15: Questions 37-39
Leader: What does it mean when we say Jesus “suffered”?
All: Throughout His whole life on earth, and especially at the end, Christ experienced in His body and soul the anger of God against the sin of the whole human race. Jesus did this so that, by His suffering as the only atoning sacrifice, He might set us completely free from eternal condemnation, and gain for us God’s grace, righteousness, and eternal life.
Leader: Why did Jesus suffer “under Pontius Pilate” as a human judge?
All: So that Jesus, though perfectly innocent, might be condemned by a human judge, and so free us from the severe judgment of God that was to fall on us.
Leader: Is it significant that Jesus was “crucified” instead of dying some other way?
All: Yes. This manner of death should convince us that Jesus shouldered the curse which lays on us all, since to die by crucifixion was to be accursed by God.

* **PRAYER OF CONFESSION:** (based on Galatians 3:13-14) Tom Dawson
“Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us—for it is written, ‘Cursed is everyone who is hung on a tree.’ He redeemed us so that the blessing of Abraham might come to all people through Christ, the promised Spirit through faith.” Break the curse over us and in us. Heal our personal and collective brokenness. Renew us in the joy and unity of the Holy Spirit. Lord, hear our cry of confession... (silent confession)
