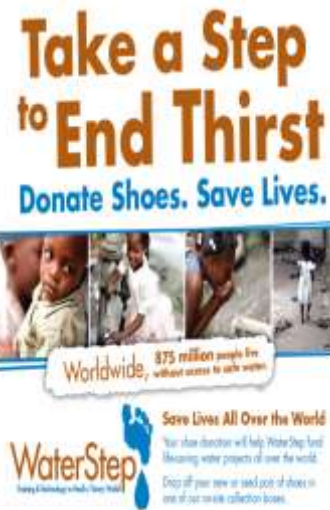
Congregational Meeting: There will be a Congregational Meeting immediately following the worship service on Sunday, September 17th.
