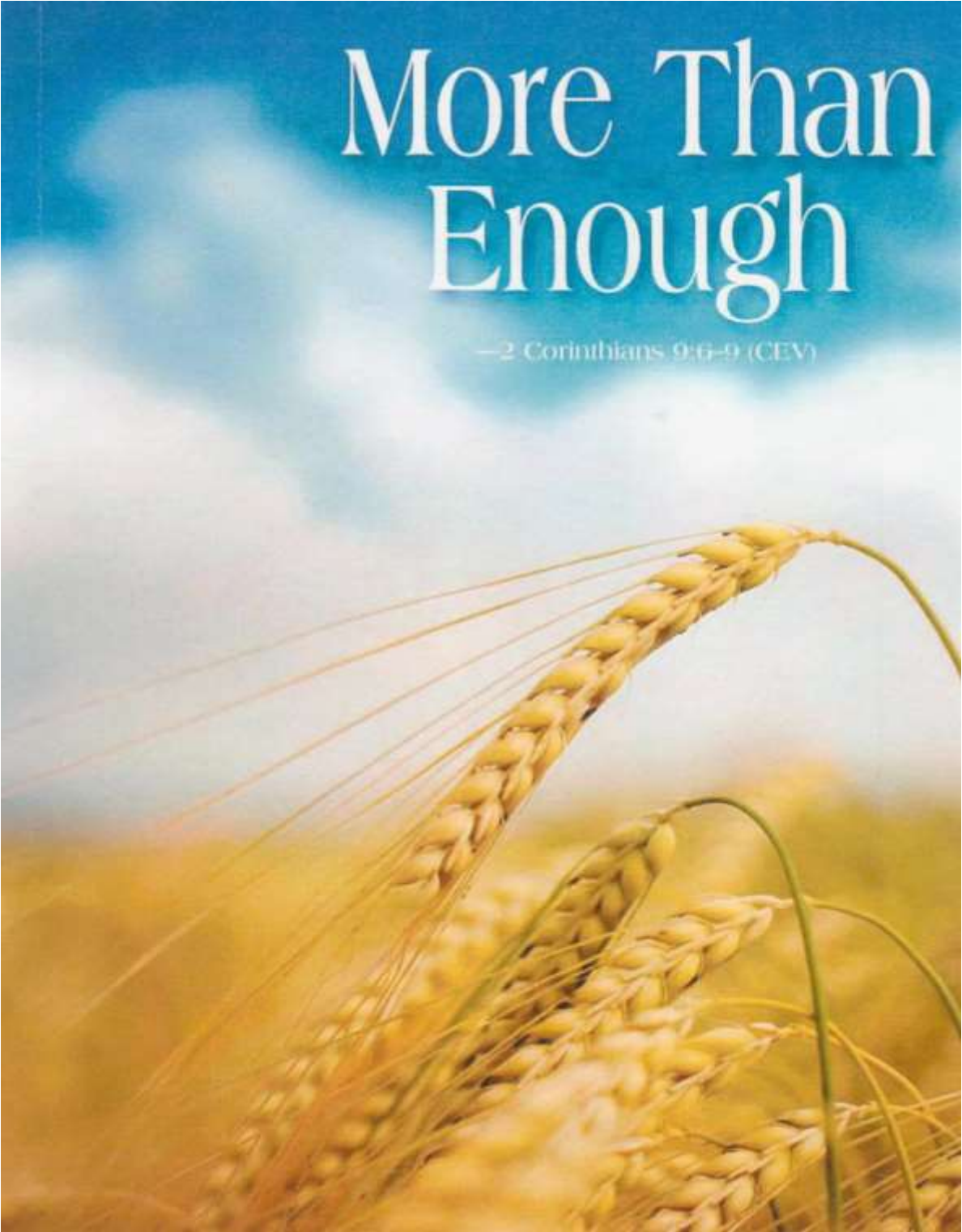

* **CONFESSING OUR FAITH:** The Heidelberg Catechism – Day 23: Questions 59-61
Leader: What good does it do to believe everything in the Apostles' Creed?

All: Everything we confess is rooted in this fact: in Christ alone we are made right with God, and become heirs of everlasting life.

Leader: How are we made right with God?

All: We are made right with God only by true faith in Jesus Christ. Even though we are guilty sinners before God, and even though we are bent toward rebelliousness against God, by sheer grace alone, not because we deserve it, God gifts us with the perfect faithfulness, righteousness, and holiness of Christ. We are made new in Christ, just as if we had never sinned, just as if we had always obeyed God. All we need to do is accept God's gracious gift with a believing heart.

Leader: Why is it “by faith alone” that each of us can be made right with God?

All: It is not because my faith makes God pleased with me. Only Jesus makes God pleased with me. Faith is the only way to show I am totally dependent on God and not on myself in any way.
