

Reflections on Being a Church Choir Member by Janis Ruping



In these days of self-absorption, self promotion, and self-interest being a member of a choir offers a striking contrast. Choir is about being a part of something larger than yourself. Singing in a church choir is all about "us" not "me." In a choir, if you stand out you are doing something wrong. While you may fear going it alone, in a choir you join other altos, tenors, sopranos and baritones, and together you make it possible for something powerful to happen.

And something powerful does happen. Choir becomes a place of service in the church, a place to grow, a small group, a glimpse of heaven, a front-row seat, and ultimately, a lesson about life in the church.

In choir, we make a commitment to participate in worship, and to join with the pastoral staff as they lead the congregation in worship. The pieces we sing are carefully chosen to enhance the texts. We sing for baptism, funerals, and during communion. We sing in the midst of our hectic lives, through our own joys and sorrows, because sometimes, when things are the hardest for us, we need to sign. By our very plan, or order of worship. Early each new year, Trinity Presbyterian Women reports the results of our mutual efforts from our Christmas fundraising event. Our contribution to this issue of Trinity Times will be in that vein.

The Christmas Sale as we know it has morphed over many years. Not too long ago we sold only holiday cookies (the "Cookie Walk"), and years before that we offered a traditional Christmas "Bizarre". Some of our women still have ornaments they made for the Bizarre over thirty years ago under the leadership of Barbara Marshall. In those days the purpose of the event was solely to raise money for Eastern Area Community Ministries (EACM). Today's TPW has maintained the Christmas Sale to continue helping EACM financially, but also other worthy ministries.

Every dollar that is raised by TPW goes to groups that improve the welfare of children, women and families. As of yet, not one confection or craft contributor has asked to be reimbursed for ingredients, materials, supplies they use to make their holiday creations. It is understood that such requests would take away from the partners we support. We are so grateful for the help given by our faithful church members.

At the December 2017 meeting of the TPW Board, with much thought and prayer, money earned from the Middletown Fun Festival and Christmas Sale were disbursed to a number of charities. Many are organizations that we have supported for decades, some for only a couple of years. Some have been serving the community for over one-hundred years. Some are in rural areas of Kentucky and don't have a large population of donors on which to lean. Periodically one can catch a report about them on a local news broadcast. All are doing work that we admire and feel strongly represent our mission. \$325 was given to each of the following:


