Trinity Presbyterian Women will be holding their first meeting on Tuesday September 11th at 10.30 a.m. in the Parlor. Our Bible study this year is “Cloud of Witnesses” from PW/Horizons PC (USA) – an informal and lively discussion of Hebrews. A new addition this year will be a couple of special events when, in place of the regular study, we will have a guest speaker to bring us discussions of their work/mission or relevant Christian topic.

Presbyterian women have been gathering together for decades and although there have been many changes in women’s roles in society, our group here at Trinity Presbyterian feel it is important to continue the study of God’s word – and put it into practice. Article Two of our By-Laws addresses the Purpose of TPW:

- To be obedient to God’s call in Jesus Christ, we unite to help one another grow in Christian faith and understanding.
- To serve Christ and His church at home and abroad.
- To act in Christian concern in the company of God’s people everywhere.

In pursuit of these goals, money raised through Sew n’ Sews craft and bake sales, and other TPW donations is generously distributed to local charities that serve children at risk, families in need, the homeless, those in distress or in need of medical/dental care, youth education and also medical needs in developing nations. In the past year 2017/2018 a total of \$7,629.54 has been distributed to these humanitarian efforts. Here are just a few of the organizations who receive donations from our benevolence fund:

- Galilean Home Ministries – a non-profit, donation-funded ministry in Liberty, Kentucky that provides children of all ages a place to call home with love, care, medical attention, education, employment and recreation.
- The Healing Place – a non-profit organization located in Louisville, Kentucky that provides food, shelter and clothing to men and women suffering from the disease of drug and alcohol addiction. It is one of the most effective long-term social recovery programs in the nation.
- Family Community Clinic – a non-profit clinic located in Louisville, Kentucky offers free primary healthcare services and wellness education to uninsured adults and children. It is staffed primarily by volunteer physicians and healthcare professionals from the community. We encourage anyone who would like to become part of a fellowship that not only studies God’s word in an informal setting but is happily serving the community in which we all live, to come and join us on the second Tuesday of each month – study books will be available in the office beginning this week.
