The Presbytery is again working with the Mayor's Day/Week of service to collect, sort, and assemble Hygiene Kits. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance will distribute kits to victims when disasters happen in the USA. Mission committee and TPW will be responding to this call by the following activities:

TPW: A collection box will be in the Narthex during the month of March for contributions of:

- 1) hand towels (approximately 16" x 28" fingertip or bath towels)
- 2) combs
- 3) bars of soap (bath size in wrapper)
- 4) toothbrushes (in original packaging)
- 5) Band-Aids® or other adhesive bandage strips
- 6) Zip closure gallon bags to put the items in when kits are assembled
