
Sew 'n Sews in the Home

Wee Care

Adult Sunday School Class

Women's Sunday School Class

The purpose of this class is to bring women together to support one another in building their faith in Jesus Christ. This is a fun-loving group of women who are currently studying *Esther: A Woman of Strength and Dignity* by Charles Swindoll. This class meets on Sunday mornings at 9:45 AM downstairs in Classroom # 6.

Men's Sunday School Class

This men's only class has an open discussion about God's Word, so that they are better equipped to reach out to and help others grow in the grace and knowledge of Christ. This class meets on Sunday mornings at 9:45 AM downstairs in Classroom # 4.

Small Group Opportunities

The Quest

Those who are young, and young in heart, are invited to join in the quest of growing in Christ through the study of God's Word and the fellowship of mutual encouragement. This group gathers downstairs in Classroom # 5 on Sunday mornings at 9:45 AM.

Intercessory Prayer

The Intercessory Prayer Group gathers every Friday morning at 10 AM in the Parlor. All are welcome to join in this vital time of prayer and drawing closer to the heart of God.

Men's Study Group

On the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month, the men of Trinity gather for food, fellowship, and feasting on God's Word. They meet at Wild Eggs off of English Stations Rd. The study begins as 8:30 AM.

WOW - Doing Life Together

Gathering weekly on Wednesdays in the Fellowship Hall at 6 PM, this group practices the three core commitments we embrace as God's people at Trinity: Love, Grow, Serve. Love envelops us in the worship of God. Grow strengthens us as disciples of Christ. Serving expands our sacrificial service of others. By doing "life together" we regularly share in a meal, Bible study, and practical acts of service.

On Sunday, August 18, a group of 17 Trinity members went to the Maryhurst home for girls campus on Dorsey lane to refurbish their gazebo. Maryhurst is a facility where girls from pre-school to high school can come to live when their home living circumstances become too difficult. This could stem from an abusive home to if parents are incarcerated or simply abandon the girls and there are no other family members to take them in. They have living quarters and have a school that is part of the JCPS system on campus. They rely on the community to help them with special projects such as the one we did on the 18th. We had a great response to this opportunity and were able to clean the gazebo, replace the entire roof skirt, put down new pine bark mulch, seal all of the wood, and even sealed the picnic tables that the girls had adorned with their own artwork. With the great response and hard work of the Trinity team we were able to do all of this in about two hours!!! The girls of Maryhurst now have an updated and clean outdoor venue where they can talk, eat and share their lives. Thank you Trinity for your time, effort and Love in this Mission project. The girls of Maryhurst are eternally grateful. In fact they plan to have about 20 of the girls come to the Fall Festival in a few weeks. Please keep an eye open for other opportunities like this as your Mission Committee will plan to do this type of outreach again in the near future.


