For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have he same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others.

(Romans 12:4-5)

Savoring the One Who Truly Satisfies

Our lives seem to be a captivated by a perpetual and never satisfied quest for fulfillment, for purpose, for connection, for joy, for love. Even the pleasures we experience and enjoy from the good things of life eventually wear off, fade, or even create a greater sense of emptiness. It seems that we have a hunger greater than our stomach can hold.

This is precisely the dilemma I face every year at this time. For me, harvest isn't about pumpkin spice and Halloween isn't about ghouls and goblins. This is the Reese's Peanut Butter Cup season. I can easily eat an entire bag,



develop a terrible stomach ache, and yet crave more!

The fact is, God made us to be fully satisfied solely in the Savior, Jesus Christ. As simply summarized by John Piper, "God is most glorified in us when we are most satisfied in Him." This means, that the restless cravings of our life will finally find rest in the all-satisfying Savior when we seek Him as the source of our greatest joy.

Connection to the Community of Everlasting Joy

The experience of everlasting joy in the Savior isn't something we do in isolation, but through the interdependence of Christian community. Quite literally,

And as members of Christ's body, we share in the common life of Christ flowing through us together. As Paul tells us, by belonging to Christ we belong to one another. (Rom. 12:5) Sadly, too few of us engage in and fully enjoy the everlasting joy of the Savior through the shared fellowship of Christ's followers. Perhaps this stems from a deficient view of what "fellowship" is. Biblically speaking, fellowship is much more than spilling coffee on one another on a Sunday morning, or laughing over a terrible shot on the golf course. It plunges far deeper than "getting together", or experiencing a rush of relational warm fuzzies during energetic church activities.

Connection to the community of everlasting joy invites us to vulnerably invest our lives in others by sharing all we are with them. This means we willingly invest our time to be with others. We will make space in our days for others. We will share our resources with others. We will invite others to hold us accountable to our confession of faith and our commitment to the Christian community. And all of this follows from our ongoing, unending need of God's grace. Dietrich Bonhoeffer put it this way:

"It is easily forgotten that the fellowship of Christian brethren is a gift of grace, a gift of the Kingdom of God that any day may be taken from us, that the time that still separates us from utter loneliness may be brief indeed. Therefore, let him who until now has had the privilege of living a common Christian life with other Christians praise God's grace from the bottom of his heart. Let him thank God on his knees and declare: It is grace, nothing but grace, that we are allowed to live in community with Christian brethren." (Bonhoeffer, Life Together, p. 20)

From beginning to end, you and I are "made for more than me". We are made to enjoy Christ in the company of fellow Christ enjoyers. So come on, join us as we do life together!

Wee Care

Along with their weekly gathering to worship and study God's Word, the youth are also encouraged to engage in community service activities. There are also many other exciting events for the youth, such as lock-ins, citywide fellowship, and mission trips to draw these young people closer to Jesus Christ.

Adult Sunday School Opportunities

Adult Sunday School Class

By working through *The Present Word* curriculum series, this class encourages one another to grow as children of God built on Christian community and hope. This class meets on Sunday mornings at 9:45 AM in the Library.

Koinonia Sunday School Class

If you are interested in exploring your faith within a group of inquisitive and energetic people, this is the class for you. 


Youth group is going again! Middle & High School students, come on out for times of delicious food, dynamic worship, and deep Bible study...all designed to encourage you in your walk with Christ.
