Ruling Elders are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life.

Ruling Elders, together with Teaching Elders, exercise leadership, governance, spiritual discernment, and discipline, as well as serve those responsible for the life of the congregation.

- Attend a Presbytery Meeting as a representative of TPC (once or twice during term).
- Continue to study and strengthen their walk of faith in Christ.
