Elders

Throughout the Old Testament, elders were established for governing God's people. The role of elders continued in the New Testament as those who discerned the leading of the Holy Spirit and cared for God's people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling Elders are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life.

Ruling Elders, together with Teaching Elders, exercise leadership, governance, spiritual discernment, and discipline, as well as serve those responsible for the life of the congregation.

TRINITY ELDERS will...

- Be able to spiritually lead and guide the church.
- Support and attend programs of the church.
- Support the Pastor and assist as needed.
- Support the church financially, and with the dedication of time and talents.
- Attend Session meetings regularly.
- Participate in elder training when provided.
- Chair or co-chair a standing committee, and serve as a member of the Personnel Committee if chairing a committee with staff reporting to it.
- Attend a Presbytery Meeting as a representative of TPC (once or twice during term).
- Continue to study and strengthen their walk of faith in Christ.

Deacons

The ministry of deacons as set forth in Scripture is one of compassion, witness, and service, by sharing the redeeming love of Christ to the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures, or anyone in distress. Persons of spiritual character, honest reputation, exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, sincere compassion, and sound judgement should be chosen for this ministry.

TRINITY DEACONS will...

- Support and attend programs of the church.
- Support the church financially, and with the dedication of time and talents.
- Attend Deacons meetings regularly.
- Participate in deacon training when provided.
- Report to the Pastor and Session on a regular basis.
