What's It All About!

There is that timeless scene in *A Charlie Brown Christmas* where Charlie Brown lamentingly cries, "Isn't there anyone who knows what



Christmas is all about !" To this, Linus recites the Gospel story of the birth of Jesus, born in the city of David, who is the Savior...the Christ...the Lord. In the midst of Charlie Brown's deep despair, Linus lovingly shares the Gospel's Good News, that is, the hope of the world by the gift of God in Jesus, the Savior. That's what Christmas is all about.

A Great Risk

As this animated Christmas classic was being made, Charles Schulz (the Peanuts creator) had a meeting with Lee Mendelson (the show's producer) and Bill Melendez (the lead animator). During their discussion, Schulz insisted that the show include a New Testament reading of the Christmas story. Both Mendelson and Melendez voiced their concern about

reading from the Bible. "It's very dangerous for us to start talking about religion now," asserted Melendez. Schulz answered saying, "Bill, if we don't, who will?"


