Servant Leadership

While the various spheres of influence and impact in the world operate through the use of strength, demands, rules, and fear, the body of Christ...the church...functions by different



priorities and influences. Leadership among God's people operates with humility, tenderness, compassion, goodwill, a heart that is yielded to Christ, and the goal of seeing every disciples grow in the grace and knowledge of the Savior (see 2 Peter 3:18). Instead, they immerse and invest themselves deeply in working and walking together with those whom they lead. Jesus mentored His own disciples with this instruction:

"You know that the rulers of this world lord it over their people, and officials flaunt their authority over those under them. But among you it will be different. Whoever wants to be a leader among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first among you must become your slave."

(Matthew 20:25-27)

the Trinity Times). Your mini-flock




