When a new landlord acquired her building, Monica was repeatedly and falsely accused
of being late with a rent payment, or paying the rent at all. Each time, the charges were
dismissed in court, but she was becoming very worried that one day the landlord might
find a way to evict her from the affordable apartment where she had lived for more than
a decade — especially since she could not afford a lawyer.

Thankfully, Monica connected with a tenants’ rights group supported by gifts to One
Great Hour of Sharing that helped her find reasonably priced legal representation. She
learned that her new landlord has a history of forcing people from their apartments and
significantly raising the rent in violation of rent control and other housing regulations.

No longer having to face the legal system alone, Monica was vindicated yet again, and
now has the knowledge and help to secure affordable housing.
