Update from TPW

Below is an update on the Presbyterian Disaster Relief drives for the past 5 years. Thank you to all of you who have contributed items to this ministry. Also, thank you Jan Larsen for delivering our contributed items for this year to Harvey Brown Presbyterian Church. This year our donations were: 40 towels, 370 Band-Aids, 24 combs, and 50 boxes of Ziploc bags.

Presbyterian Disaster Relief — 5-year report

Over the last five years, churches in the Mid-Kentucky Presbytery, with assistance from churches in the Ohio Valley, Western Kentucky, and Transylvania presbyteries, has collected supplies and assembled PDA hygiene kits for victims of disasters. The combined total is almost 10,000 hygiene kits!

Despite the Covid-19 restrictions in 2020, we sent 800 completed hygiene kits to the Disaster Assistance Center in Ferncliff, Arkansas. We also delivered:

- ◇ 1,000 Ziploc bags and 24 boxes of bags
- ◇ 4,577 Band-Aides and 10 boxes of Band-Aids
- ◇ 1,388 combs
- ◇ 917 hand towels
- ◇ 1,176 nail clippers
- ◇ 1,327 bars of soap
- ◇ 471 tooth brushes
- ◇ 798 wash cloths

We are grateful to all the churches, community groups, corporations, schools, Presbyterian Women, and neighborhoods who faithfully served people in need in this joint mission.
