The Context of the Corinthians Church

Seven Assurances about Giving Stewardship

- 1. Giving is an act of planting. (v. 6)
- 2. Giving is an expression of our joy. (v. 7)
- 3. Giving plunges us deeper into God's grace. (v. 8)
- 4. Giving reminds us that God is our sole Supplier. (v. 9-10)
- 5. Giving awakens thanksgiving in us and others. (v. 11-12)
- 6. Giving proclaims the Gospel. (v. 13-14)
- 7. Giving glorifies God. (v. 15)

- 1. Do you see stewardship differently as a result of this message? If so, in what ways?
