The picture below is of Kimhaeng. According to Samaritan's Purse, "Kimhaeng received a shoebox gift at the age of 14. It was the first gift she ever received! Some of her favorite items were school supplies because her parents couldn't afford to buy them for her." Another story told of a young man (age 22) who still has the composition notebook he received in his shoebox when he was 11 years old. It was a treasure to find school supplies in his shoebox as his family was not able to provide those items.

"Sometimes a shoebox is the first gift a child receives. This makes it an incredibly powerful representation of the Greatest Gift—Jesus! Each shoebox you pack carries the Gospel message to another boy or girl like Kimhaeng!"
