### **Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes**

School supplies are the much-needed item to collect for August...pencils, pencil sharpeners, pens, erasers, notebooks (paper), solar calculators, protractors, rulers, glue sticks, scissors, etc.

The picture below is of Kimhaeng. According to Samaritan's Purse, "Kimhaeng received a shoebox gift at the age of 14. It was the first gift she ever received! Some of her favorite items were school supplies because her parents couldn't afford to buy them for her." Another story told of a young man (age 22) who still has the composition notebook he received in his shoebox when he was 11 years old. It was a treasure to find school supplies in his shoebox as his family was not able to provide those items. "Sometimes a shoebox is the first gift a child receives. This makes it an incredibly powerful representation of the Greatest Gift—Jesus! Each shoebox you pack carries the Gospel message to another boy or girl like Kimhaeng!"

## John 6:60-71

<sup>60</sup> When many of his disciples heard it, they said, "This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?" <sup>61</sup> But Jesus, knowing in himself that his disciples were grumbling about this, said to them, "Do you take offense at this? <sup>62</sup> Then what if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? <sup>63</sup> It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh is no help at all. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. <sup>64</sup> But there are some of you who do not believe." (For Jesus knew from the beginning who those were who did not believe, and who it was who would betray him.) <sup>65</sup> And he said, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by the Father."

<sup>66</sup> After this many of his disciples turned back and no longer walked with him. <sup>67</sup> So Jesus said to the twelve, "Do you want to go away as well?" <sup>68</sup> Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life, <sup>69</sup> and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God." <sup>70</sup> Jesus answered them, "Did I not choose you, the twelve? And yet one of you is a devil." <sup>71</sup> He spoke of Judas the son of Simon Iscariot, for he, one of the twelve, was going to betray him.

Following the devastating Aug. 14 earthquake in Haiti, nearly 1,500 people are dead, thousands more injured and an unknown number still missing. Some 13,000 homes were destroyed and roads, bridges and communication systems damaged. Because Haiti is already facing endemic hunger and poverty, COVID-19, continuing civil unrest and the arrival of Tropical Storm Grace, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing emergency relief and short-term recovery through our established local partners and in collaboration with ACT Alliance. The PC(USA), through PDA, will remain active throughout the entire recovery process, accompanying our partners in the area as they determine long-term program needs and providing financial support for rebuilding and resilience.
