Wisdom for Life

"If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him."

(James 1:5)

A Common Longing: Wisdom.

We all want direction, guidance, advice...we need wisdom. We look for it in all kinds of places. A song that inspires. A movie that stirs our heart. A mentor who motivates us. A place that touches us profoundly. Whether words or people or places, innumerable things inspire us.

Often, simple, short, and clear sayings anchor in us very deep and empowering truths that propel our lives. They can give direction when we've lost our way. They can remind us of what we've forgotten. They can



summarize things of lengthy significance. But, there's usually a limit to these sayings. They can be situational or seasonal or subjective in their importance. They don't seem to apply equally everywhere to everyone.

So, where can we turn, to whom can we turn, to get irrefutable and perfect insight and inspiration? From where can we gain wisdom for life? The book of Proverbs!

The Point of the Proverbs: Wisdom!

Proverbs is intended to make us wise as we live in a relationship with the One who is wisdom itself. Wisdom is "skill, expertise, competence that understands how life really works, how to achieve successful and even beautiful results." (Ray Ortlund, Jr.) Wisdom is knowledge that starts with God and begins nowhere but in God first. The 19th century pastor, Adam Clarke, stated as much when he said: "No one can ever become truly wise who does not begin with God, the Fountain of knowledge; and those whose mind is influenced by the fear and love of God will learn more in a month than others will in a year."

Proverbs 1:7 says: "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge; but fools despise wisdom and instruction." This very well might be a summer of the entire book of Proverbs. Proverbs

instructs, initiates, and inspires us in loving God ("the fear of the LORD"). By loving God, we then learn what God wills and wants ("the beginning of knowledge"). As we love God and increasingly learn from Him, we will want what He wants, will what He wills, and walk as He walks (we won't "despise wisdom and instruction" like the fools!).



Know this, too, Proverbs is incredibly practical and unmistakably "in touch with" real life. This isn't an esoteric, "pie in the sky", philosophically complex book. In and through Proverbs, God meets us in the details and decisions of life. And God speaks, God offers clear guidance to help us make God-honoring choices. The

"rubber hits the road" reality of Proverbs speaks into every aspect of life. For instance, Proverbs offers wisdom on such questions as:

- What should kids do with their parents?
- How are we to raise our kids?
- · How do I make good work decisions?
- What is the secret to a successful marriage?
- How can I make and maintain good friendships?
- How can we tell the difference between the truth (wisdom) and a lie (foolishness)?
- How can I navigate the complexities of life without horribly screwing up?

And there is something for everyone, rich or poor, old or young, man or woman, Godinterested or God-indifferent. These simple, short, and striking statements pierce us. And once they hit us, they won't let us wiggle out of their grip. We have to face its insight. We must struggle with its claim. We must decide whether we will surrender to its influence or stubbornly insist on doing our own thing. But let's be crystal clear about this: Proverbs offers us only two choices—wisdom or folly, truth or error, life or death, God or nothing. In this sense, the choice is ours. Which "way" will you choose?



Seek After a Heart of Wisdom (Psalm 90:12)

As we watch and walk in a world that is increasingly lost, divided, and woefully broken, let the Word of God and the God of the Word root and reorient your life. Reading, pondering, and practicing the Proverbs is one way we can "walk in the light, as he is in the light, and so have fellowship with one another..." (see I John 1:7)

AN UPDATE FROM TPW

May 11, Dolli Neikirk, Director of Lifehouse and Kristin Kennedy, Development Manager, presented information about this program that shelters pregnant women who want to keep their babies but have no support to do this. Lifehouse can care for 6 pregnant women and 6 parenting women and their children, for a total of 12 moms plus their children. While this doesn't sound like much, Lifehouse is a lifeline for these women and children while they are in transition, helping them learn infant and home care, enabling them to obtain an education, and ultimately to find steady work. Lifehouse is one of the ministries supported by Trinity through fundraising sales of Sew 'n Sews crafts.

In July, as part of a developing relationship with Lifehouse, Sew 'n Sews prepared and delivered two keepsake boxes filled with scarves, costume and fine jewelry gifts, to the Lifehouse residents. The donation was made possible by contributions from the collection of Sheryl Yoffe's beloved Aunt Helen, who had recently passed away. In August, Sew 'n Sews members were invited to a prayer dedication kick off for a remodel of the Lifehouse kitchen. Grants for the remodel were from Presbyterian Women USA, Women 4 Women, Southeast Christian Church, Christ Church United Methodist, and Younger Woman's Club of Louisville. Lifehouse did not have personal relationships with Presbyterian Women (USA) and invited the Sew 'n Sews as representatives of our national group. Stacy Mills and Sandra Hollensead joined ministers and members of the above donor groups in the remodel space on August 6. After prayers of blessing and dedication, attendees wrote encouraging messages and excerpts from scripture on walls and boards that would be later covered. Thus the new kitchen will have hope, love, and blessings literally built into the walls and supports to cover residents, who will learn nutrition and cooking in the improved space. Also, grants from the Jamie Parsley Family Foundation and ARGI Financial Group will be used to purchase new furniture for the common living room space.



Prayers are lifted up for the residents who will find a home and new direction for their lives with their baby as they learn new life skills.



Messages and blessings are inscribed on supporting walls and boards.



Support Haiti in its hour of greatest need



And after the earthquake ... a sound of sheer silence. Then there came a voice ... that said, "What are you doing here?" (1 Kings 19:12-13)

Following the devastating Aug. 14 earthquake in Haiti, nearly 1,500 people are dead, thousands more injured and an unknown number still missing. Some 13,000 homes were destroyed and roads, bridges and communication systems damaged. Because Haiti is already facing endemic hunger and poverty, COVID-19, continuing civil unrest and the arrival of Tropical Storm Grace, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing emergency relief and short-term recovery through our established local partners and in collaboration with ACT Alliance. The PC(USA), through PDA, will remain active throughout the entire recovery process, accompanying our partners in the area as they determine long-term program needs and providing financial support for rebuilding and resilience.
