1 Kings 19:1-12




Sew 'n Sews Halloween Sale

Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes

We have heard that the collection item for October is the most important of all a LETTER and PHOTO! Whether packing your personal boxes at home, or helping to pack the boxes for our church, please take the time to write a personal note of encouragement and include a photo. We are providing blank Christmas cards in the Narthex that you use. Please return the completed cards to the box marked in the Narthex. We do plan to provide a standard letter with photo from Trinity that will be photocopied so that every child receiving a box from Trinity will receive our personal message of love and hope.

»»» It's shoebox packing time!

As you know, we have been collecting supplies and gifts all year long for packing into the shoe-boxes. Well, it's finally time to start packing! Our "packing party" will be structured the same as last year. Classroom #6 has been set up with all of the supplies we have to pack into the boxes and the packing guidelines are posted in the classroom.

We planned for packing the Trinity boxes from October 10th through October 31st, with one-hour time slots offered on Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday. If you feel compelled to help with this ministry, the sign-up sheets are posted on the Mission Committee bulletin board or you may call Sherry at the church office. If you would like a date or time other than what is listed on the sign-up sheets, simply let your request be known. Two important reminders regarding packing: come prepared with your own personal notes/pictures to include in the boxes (a note and photo from Trinity will be provided if you are not able to provide your own) and after you pack the boxes, pray for the children who will receive them.

You will also note that the Operation Christmas Child table is set up in the Narthex! Please stop by to pick up an empty shoebox (or a few of them) and pack your personal boxes with gifts that represent your love for God and neighbor. Whether you've been collecting gifts all year with the items of the month or need to do some shopping ... either way, be encouraged to exceed the number of boxes you packed last year. And if you have never personally packed a box, it really is a message of love and hope for the child who will receive it!

OCC's national drop-off week is November 15 – November 22 so there is plenty of time for you and your family to participate in this ministry. Every shoebox is a gospel opportunity and Samaritan's Purse tells us that one child hearing the Good News can impact about ten people.


