Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes



We are approximately halfway to goal! As of this writing, 213 boxes have been packed. We are hoping and praying to pack a total of 450 “gospel opportunity” boxes. Think about it....each box represents a child and his or her family. If we reach our goal, 450 children and families around the world will be impacted by the expression of God’s love as a shoebox gift and by learning about His Son, Jesus Christ.

Packing that many boxes is a blessing and it comes with the challenge of paying for the shipping and processing costs, which totals \$4,050. The Mission Committee has budgeted \$2,700 for these costs and will be in a deficit assuming we reach our goal. With that in mind, the item for the month of November is a donation for shipping. We ask that you please consider making a donation by November 14th. Samaritan’s Purse offers the ability to track boxes to see where they have been delivered and these special labels need to be paid for and activated before the boxes are packed. You may make your donation to Trinity Presbyterian Church, OCC Shipping.

“Today I shipped internationally for the first time in my life, and I want to THANK YOU for ONLY charging \$9 for shipping! A one-pound package to Colombia was over \$12. Thank you for providing this service!”—Heather P.

“To have the shipping money, I stopped drinking soda or tea at restaurants. It saves about \$2 anytime we go out. I put that \$2 in my change jar.”—Cathy W.
