
SINGLES FUN BUNCH!!

Carrie Dodson, head nurse, provided this information regarding the effect of these materials: "Patients entering the hospital, on average for a one week stay, are very anxious. If they have received one of the TPC gifts before, they may ask for another. The books give them something to hold, look at, and read in the long time periods hospitalization allows. If there are enough of one type of devotional, patients will organize a discussion group amongst themselves using the books. Staff may also take one of our materials and discuss their reading with patients as they interact together. Patients continue to improve as medication is provided. If desired, the study book may be taken home. "We do this because we know you will bring more." Please pray for Wellstone patients and staff, that healing will be accomplished through our partnership. The empty box has been returned to the Narthex to fill again. As Carrie agrees, faith materials help patients cope with times of acute illness. Onward Christian Soldiers!
