A Reminder to Remember

You are likely familiar with the Pixar character Dorsey from the Finding Nemo movie. This beloved blue fish is known for struggling with a weak short-term memory. Throughout the movie, Dorsey struggles to remember who she is, where she came from, and even conversations she's had with other characters. Like Dorsey, we wrestle with a weak memory. And we need to be regularly reminded to remember who God is and what God has said, and to remember who we are and how we are to respond to God. **The Essence of Worship**

"Everyone is a worshiper."

Author and social critic, David Foster Wallace once commented, "In the day-to-day trenches of adult life, there is actually no such thing as atheism. There is no such thing as not worshiping. Everybody worships. The only choice we get is what to worship." He is right. Well, mostly right. Everyone is a worshiper and worships something or someone. And we do get to choose what or who the object of our worship is. However, Wallace left out one important fact: there are consequences to the object or subject we choose to worship.

Who We Worship Matters...Eternally

One of the ways I tend to define worship is like this: "Worship is making much of, in word and action, that which we love most." Notice, like Wallace, this leaves room for anyone or anything to be the object of our worship! Hence the reason why God's Word is filled with so many prohibitions and prescriptions. And each of the thousands of "do's and don'ts" in Scripture are aimed at one primary goal: rightly knowing God so that we will rightly worship God.

Lavishly Loving God

As we look more closely at John 4, at the core of the interaction between Jesus and the Samaritan woman is the fact and function of worship.

The Jews and the Samaritans (some background information)

Barriers and Distinctions

The woman was shocked and unsettled by Jesus and his request because there were four barriers between them: 1) their gender difference, 2) their racial difference, 3) their cultural difference, and 4) their religious difference.

Revealing Her True Need and His True Supply <u>The topic of "living water" (v. 7-15)</u>

Water nourishes and renews the natural person The Holy Spirit nourishes and renews the spiritual person

Christ, the Living Water, invigorates us with genuine and eternal life.

The topic of "true worship" (v. 16-26)

Jesus reveals who she really is and what she really needs.

Worship is not primarily about the outward acts we do for God, but the inward attitude, ambition, and appetite of our heart for God.

The Samaritan woman emphasized the place, the priesthood, and the practice of sacrifice as the essence of true worship. Jesus shifted the essence of worship to the disposition and desire of the heart.

Worship isn't authentic and Spirit-filled because certain songs of a particular style are sung, a loose or detailed order of service is followed, people stand or sit, hands are raised or folded, prayers are written or spontaneous, there are pews or chairs or nothing, an organ is played or voices are the only instrument, song are projected or printed in a hymnal, a service is kept to an hour or it ends when it ends. All the outward, ceremonial, liturgical, religious acts we do is not the heart of worship. At the heart of worship is worship that flows from the heart, and this heart is one to which and through which Christ, the Living Water indwells, enlivens, and eternal nourishes.



<u>Koinonia</u>

The Koinonia class is a seminar-based gathering that is presently focused on an introduction to the New Testament (its formation

introduction to the New Testament (its formation, history, background, and content). It spends some time on the individual books but at this point doesn't make an in-depth study of a particular one. In the past, the class has studied the history of the Church and a long-term study of the book of Acts. This coming year the focus will be on the writings of Paul, other letters, and the book of Revelation. The first gatherings will consist of a review of covered material. Participants can join the class in the Parlor or via Zoom.

Resources include video lectures from Dr. Dale Martin of Yale University and presentation slides. The style is a relaxed one with much attention paid to questions, concerns, and insights of those involved.

Digging Deeper

There are two important ways we immerse ourselves in the Word of God. One way is through the sermon during our gathered times of worship. The other is through personal and corporate Bible Study. To this end, and in addition to the other Sunday school classes we offer, Pastor Steve leads this study as we dig deeper into the Bible passage for next week's sermon.
