#### Security Can Lead to Softness

All of us crave and strive for a sense of security. And yet, if and when we achieve that security, it is very tempting to settle in, to become flippant, to become soft. Consider these relatable scenarios:

An employee who takes their job for granted...

A husband who stops pursuing his wife...

A wife who stops cherishing her husband...

An athlete who coasts once achieving success...

A student who settles for what they already know...

When this happens, not only can we grow soft, but we can stop growing altogether.

#### **Growing Is More Than Self-Improvement**

Our security in Christ doesn't stifle our ambition, but reorients our ambition. Now, as those who are safe and secure in Christ, we long to become more like Jesus. We long to grow.

The goal of growing, contrary to the world's way, is not to become a better or the best version of yourself. Rather, the true goal of growing is to more clearly and more consistently resemble the image of God, specifically, to resemble the Lord Jesus Christ.

What does it mean to grow in Christ? It means to increase in your personal knowledge of Christ and become more constant in your love for him and your obedience to him.

# **Christian Education Opportunities**

#### Koinonia

The Koinonia class is a seminar-based gathering that is presently focused on an introduction to the New Testament (its formation, history, background, and content). It spends some time on the individual books but at this point doesn't make an in-depth study of a particular one. In the past, the class has studied the history of the Church and a long-term study of the book of Acts. This coming year the focus will be on the writings of Paul, other letters, and the book of Revelation. The first gatherings will consist of a review of covered material. Participants can join the class in the Parlor or via Zoom.

Resources include video lectures from Dr. Dale Martin of Yale University and presentation slides. The style is a relaxed one with much attention paid to questions, concerns, and insights of those involved.

#### **Digging Deeper**

There are two important ways we immerse ourselves in the Word of God. One way is through the sermon during our gathered times of worship. The other is through personal and corporate Bible Study. To this end, and in addition to the other Sunday school classes we offer, Pastor Steve leads this study as we dig deeper into the Bible passage for next week's sermon. We gather on Monday mornings at 10 AM in the Library.
