The Imprisoning Effect of Indebtedness

Rampant Debt in America

While observing the lifestyles of Americans, an international once remarked that it is a wonder more Americans don't own elephants. All that will likely change once they're available for zero down and a low monthly payment.

As of the third quarter of 2023, the average household debt in America equaled \$104,215. Between car loans, credit card debt, and student loans, this amount exceeded the average household income by \$14,000. The average American isn't just living paycheck to paycheck; they are digging a financial hole at a rate of \$1170 per month, or \$270 per week.

Universal Indebtedness to God

What's worse than all this financial indebtedness? The debt we owe to God, our spiritual indebtedness. For all of us are rebels who have abandoned our relationship with God, who made us and has the right over us. We find ourselves bankrupt before and indebted to God, who is the source, substance, and supplier of all we need, because we seek fulfillment in this world, which can only be found in another world.

A Certainty and Security of Those in Christ – v. 13

Paul isn't saying that a genuine believer can lose their salvation ("die"). Rather, he is saying that a person whose life is characterized by the things of the flesh is not a true Christian, is not really "in Christ", but are still spiritually dead, no matter what their religious affiliation, involvement, or interests may be.

Consider the lesson in the parable of the ten lepers found in Luke 17:11-19...

Untraining and Retraining the Our Habitual Living

As those who are new creations in Christ, where our old nature is done away with and we are given a new (spiritually alive to God) nature, we have to engage in the long, slow, and persistent work of untraining and retraining. Our old nature has rigorously and exhaustively trained our mind to think, our body to act, and our will to hunger in a way consistent with opposition to God. Now, the entrenched habits of our mind, body, and will must be trained to think, act, and hunger consistent with the fellowship we now enjoy with God through Christ in the Holy Spirit.

Christian Education Opportunities

<u>Koinonia</u>

The Koinonia class is a seminar-based gathering that is presently focused on an introduction to the New Testament (its formation,

history, background, and content). It spends some time on the individual books but at this point doesn't make an in-depth study of a particular one. In the past, the class has studied the history of the Church and a long-term study of the book of Acts. This coming year the focus will be on the writings of Paul, other letters, and the book of Revelation. The first gatherings will consist of a review of covered material. Participants can join the class in the Parlor or via Zoom.

Resources include video lectures from Dr. Dale Martin of Yale University and presentation slides. The style is a relaxed one with much attention paid to questions, concerns, and insights of those involved.

Digging Deeper

There are two important ways we immerse ourselves in the Word of God. One way is through the sermon during our gathered times of worship. The other is through personal and corporate Bible Study.
