Pain Is Just Part of the Process

St. Patrick was given the opportunity to baptize King Aengus, an Irish king. During the ceremony, St. Patrick leaned on his sharp-pointed staff, accidently stabbing the king's foot. Groaning for Glory

Present Suffering and Future Glory - v. 18

The magnitude of the future glory awaiting us (and the creation) far exceeds any and all suffering we may endure in this life.

The Groaning of the Creation – v. 19-22

The Creation's Eager Expectation (v. 19)

Something is amiss, not yet right, and the creation knows and remembers. It groans longing to experience redemption and renewal.

The Creation's Appointed Futility (v 20-21)

The creation is not at fault for the corruption it experiences; we are! What was meant to be our ally in glorifying and enjoying God, has become our adversary to glorifying and enjoying God.

The Creation's Agonizing Anguish (v. 22)

Groaning under the corruption it suffers because of our rebellion against God.

The Groaning of the Children of God – v. 23-25

The people of the world groan for the earth's healing, but they do not groan like the people of God, who do so for the redemptive restoration of the entire creation.

Those who are in Christ groan with and like the creation does. We groan as those agonizing against our old nature, even as we lamentingly groan for the Holy Spirit's help now and the Lord Jesus Christ's full and final healing brought about at His triumphant return.

Operation Christmas Child - 2024 Quick Facts

DISCIPLESHIP:

- The Greatest Journey is a follow-up discipleship experience offered through local churches to many of the children who receive shoebox gifts. The 12-lesson program introduces boys and girls to salvation through faith in Jesus and encourages them to grow as faithful followers.
- Over the past 30 years (since 1993), more than 50 million children have been discipled, including 25 million children who have prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior!
- Shoebox to Bible: After a child completes the 12-weeks discipleship program, a New Testament Bible is given to each child in their language. So far, over 36 million New Testaments have been given to graduates through our local church partners.
- Samaritan's Purse trains over **240,500+ volunteer teachers** to lead children through The Greatest Journey program.
- In 2023, The Greatest Journey discipleship program was translated in 91 languages and reached 98 countries!
- In 2023, over 5.1 million children participated in The Greatest Journey discipleship program and there were nearly 2.9 million decisions for Christ, equating to 331 children coming to faith each hour!
- Pray for over 5.5 million children to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program in 2024!

Christian Education Opportunities

Koinonia

The Koinonia class is a seminar-based gathering that is presently focused on an introduction to the New Testament (its formation, history, background, and content). It spends some time on the individual books but at this point doesn't make an in-depth study of a particular one. In the past, the class has studied the history of the Church and a long-term study of the book of Acts. This coming year the focus will be on the writings of Paul, other letters, and the book of Revelation. The first gatherings will consist of a review of covered material. Participants can join the class in the Parlor or via Zoom.

Resources include video lectures from Dr. Dale Martin of Yale University and presentation slides. The style is a relaxed one with much attention paid to questions, concerns, and insights of those involved.

Digging Deeper

There are two important ways we immerse ourselves in the Word of God. One way is through the sermon during our gathered times of worship. The other is through personal and corporate Bible Study. To this end, and in addition to the other Sunday school classes we offer, Pastor Steve leads this study as we dig deeper into the Bible passage for next week's sermon. We gather on Monday mornings at 10 AM in the Library.
