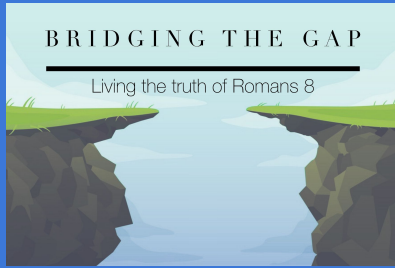

## BRIDGING THE GAP:

### Groaning for Glory

*Romans 8:18-25*

#### The Pomp and Pageantry of Palm Sunday

*Christ's Determination to Go to Jerusalem (Luke 9:51)*

To fulfill the determined and destined plan of God.

*The Crowds Enthusiasm and Expectation (Matthew 21:1-11; Mark 11:1-11; Luke 19:28-40; John 12:12-19)*

“Hosanna” was a plea meaning “save now”.

1. Christ's spreading “celebrity”
2. Christ's apparent “authority”
3. Christ's anticipated “victory”

*The Crowds Failure and Forsaking*

Those joyfully chanting “Hosanna!” would soon sneeringly cry, “Crucify him!” Some even went so far as to mock the meaning “save” by reviling Christ while on the cross (see Matt. 27:41-44).

**“In the same way...” (Romans 8:26a)**

Apply the work of Christ to our life, the Holy Spirit sets us free from condemnation (v. 1), usher us into a new freedom (v. 2-8), quickens us with new life (v. 9-17), cares for us through various trials and tribulations (v. 18-25), and relentlessly helps us in our weakness (v. 26-30).

## All Things for Good

*The Holy Spirit's Assistance — v. 26-27*

Highlight and emphasize our pervasive weakness...

“There is no such thing as an arrogant, conceited, self-reliant disciple of Jesus Christ.” (Phil. 2:3)

The Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness (v. 26a) and our ignorance (v. 26b).

The Holy Spirit searches our hearts (v. 27a) and guides us in God's will (v. 27b)

*The Holy Spirit's Assurance — v. 28*

“And we know...” – this is the main point, the main instruction, the main goal of the truth of Romans 8...that we would, without a shadow of doubt, be fully knowledgeable of and absolutely confident in the active and ongoing work of God in our life.

God works...

In all things... (all events) AND All things... (outcomes)

For those who love God and called according to His purpose...

*The Holy Spirit's Activity — v. 29-30*

Foreknown – God knows and loves even before a person is.

Predestined (to be conformed to Christ and to securely enjoy adoption as a Christ's “sibling”) – God's willful decision before any response by someone.

Called – God's act of drawing, working on, and claiming people as His own.

Justified – God's legal declaration of innocence and freedom to someone.

Glorified – God's ongoing and certain to be finished work in someone's life.

## The Reason for Confidence and Hope

While we are not quite at the crescendo of Romans 8, verse by verse the end to which these connecting links point is becoming clearer and stronger: for those who are in Christ, nothing can or ever will separate them from Christ. Once in God's grip, He will never let you go!

## Operation Christmas Child – 2024 Quick Facts

### **DISCIPLESHIP:**

- **The Greatest Journey** is a follow-up discipleship experience offered through local churches to many of the children who receive shoebox gifts. The **12-lesson program** introduces boys and girls to salvation through faith in Jesus and encourages them to grow as faithful followers.
- Over the past 30 years (since 1993), **more than 50 million children** have been discipled, **including 25 million children who have prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior!**
- **Shoebox to Bible:** After a child completes the 12-weeks discipleship program, a **New Testament Bible** is given to each child in their language. So far, **over 36 million New Testaments** have been given to graduates through our local church partners.
- Samaritan's Purse trains over **240,500+ volunteer teachers** to lead children through The Greatest Journey program.
- In 2023, The Greatest Journey discipleship program was translated in **91 languages** and reached **98 countries!**
- In 2023, over **5.1 million children** participated in **The Greatest Journey** discipleship program and there were **nearly 2.9 million decisions for Christ**, equating to 331 children coming to faith each hour!
- Pray for over **5.5 million children** to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program in 2024!

# Christian Education Opportunities

## Koinonia

The Koinonia class is a seminar-based gathering that is presently focused on an introduction to the New Testament (its formation, history, background, and content). It spends some time on the individual books but at this point doesn't make an in-depth study of a particular one. In the past, the class has studied the history of the Church and a long-term study of the book of Acts. This coming year the focus will be on the writings of Paul, other letters, and the book of Revelation. The first gatherings will consist of a review of covered material. Participants can join the class in the Parlor or via Zoom.

Resources include video lectures from Dr. Dale Martin of Yale University and presentation slides. The style is a relaxed one with much attention paid to questions, concerns, and insights of those involved.

## Digging Deeper

There are two important ways we immerse ourselves in the Word of God. One way is through the sermon during our gathered times of worship. The other is through personal and corporate Bible Study. To this end, and in addition to the other Sunday school classes we offer, Pastor Steve leads this study as we dig deeper into the Bible passage for next week's sermon. We gather on Monday mornings at 10 AM in the Library.
