Pilate: "Joseph, I really don't understand. You're one of the richest men in the region, and you've spent a small fortune on a new tomb for you and your family. Are you sure you want to give it to this man, Jesus?"

Joseph: "Sure. It's only for the weekend!"

Evidence for the Resurrection of Christ

The Falsifiable Religion

Among all the religions of the world, Christianity is perhaps the most falsifiable of all. While the founder of every other religion died (and stayed dead), Jesus Christ died and is claimed to be alive again. So, if it could be proven that Christ did not rise from the dead, the whole Christian faith would crumble. The Apostle Paul even made such an observation in 1 Corinthians 15:12-19. And yet, the reliable evidence for the resurrection of Christ is substantial and overwhelming.

The eyewitness accounts of Christ's followers

(Matthew 28, Mark 16, Luke 24, John 20).

Operation Christmas Child – 2024 Quick Facts

DISCIPLESHIP:

- The Greatest Journey is a follow-up discipleship experience offered through local churches to many of the children who receive shoebox gifts. The 12-lesson program introduces boys and girls to salvation through faith in Jesus and encourages them to grow as faithful followers.
- Over the past 30 years (since 1993), more than 50 million children have been discipled, including 25 million children who have prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior!
- Shoebox to Bible: After a child completes the 12-weeks discipleship program, a New Testament Bible is given to each child in their language. So far, over 36 million New Testaments have been given to graduates through our local church partners.
- Samaritan's Purse trains over **240,500+ volunteer teachers** to lead children through The Greatest Journey program.
- In 2023, The Greatest Journey discipleship program was translated in **91 lan**guages and reached **98 countries**!
- In 2023, over **5.1 million children** participated in **The Greatest Journey** discipleship program and there were **nearly 2.9 million decisions for Christ**, equating to 331 children coming to faith each hour!
- Pray for over **5.5 million children** to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program in 2024!

<u>Koinonia</u>

The Koinonia class is a seminar-based gathering that is presently focused on an introduction to the New Testament (its formation,

history, background, and content). It spends some time on the individual books but at this point doesn't make an in-depth study of a particular one. In the past, the class has studied the history of the Church and a long-term study of the book of Acts. This coming year the focus will be on the writings of Paul, other letters, and the book of Revelation. The first gatherings will consist of a review of covered material. Participants can join the class in the Parlor or via Zoom.

Resources include video lectures from Dr. Dale Martin of Yale University and presentation slides. The style is a relaxed one with much attention paid to questions, concerns, and insights of those involved.

Digging Deeper

There are two important ways we immerse ourselves in the Word of God. One way is through the sermon during our gathered times of worship. The other is through personal and corporate Bible Study. To this end, and in addition to the other Sunday school classes we offer, Pastor Steve leads this study as we dig deeper into the Bible passage for next week's sermon.
