Earthly Tests Build Our Heavenly Trust

James 1:1-9

**Devotion to Christ in the Early Days of the Church** 

One's heavenly family was a greater priority than one's earthly family.

Each day (i.e. priorities, pursuits, and passions) revolved around one's dependence on and dedication to Christ.

Sacrifice and surrender was characteristic of the early believers, even to the giving of one's life.

### A Summary of the Message of James

A Preacher's Legacy Impact

The epistle of James summarizes the essential Christian teaching that rooted and guided the life of the first Christians, especially in the Jerusalem church, which was pastored by James, the half-brother of Jesus. This summarizes the legacy impact of James on the church.

The "Full Dimension of Faith"

Some have pitted James and Paul against one another. However, the writings and message of Paul and James are not antithetical to one another. "Together Paul and James give the full dimension of faith. Paul wrote about inner saving faith from God's perspective. James wrote about outward serving faith from man's perspective. The true seed of saving faith is verified by the tangible fruit of serving faith." (James Ronald Blue)

Faith that Works

"Faith that works" not only means that our trust in Christ is demonstrated by our "works" (by the new way of life we live as Christ's disciples), but, "faith that works" also means that our trust in Christ's redeeming work on the cross and in His resurrection "works" successfully in us. Not only is the work of Christ sufficient for our salvation, but the saving work of Christ will shine through us in our sacrificial way of life.

# **FAITH THAT WORKS: Earthly Tests Build Our Heavenly Trust**

Introduction to the Book of James

The Author: James, the half-brother of Jesus

Their Authority: a bonded servant = the property of God and servant of the eternal Lord who came as the Savior Jesus and rose again as the sovereign Christ.

Those Who Are Addressed: the twelve tribes of the scattering... as an evangelistic tract to the displaced Jews and as an encouraging treatise to the displaced disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Trials Build Our Trust (v. 2-4)

The Inevitability of Trials – "whenever you face trials..."

Trials are not punishment for past or present moral failures, but a process for forming, deepening, and maturing one's faith in and likeness to Christ. These testing trials strengthen our trust in God!

Our Engagement with Trials – "consider it pure joy..."

The Opportunity Trials Present –

"testing...perseverance...maturity..."

Wisdom Gives Us Perspective (v. 5)

Seek after God's wisdom

God's gracious generosity

Contrasting Ways of Asking (v. 6-8)

Asking in Faith - the strength of one's faith is in the one trusted, not in the one who trusts.

Asking in Doubt - doubt is not disbelief, but divided belief (see Matthew 14:30-33). "Blown" = influenced by an inferior force. "Tossed" = to be moved, agitated, fearful, and unstable

### **Put Your Behavior Where Your Belief Is**

We've all heard the phrase, "Put your money where your mouth is." This means, if someone makes a claim, then they should back up that claim with some skin in the game. If someone is telling the truth, then don't just talk about it, prove it by putting some cash on the table!

In the same way, we must not simply make the bold claim that "I am a Christian", that "Jesus is Lord of my life", unless we are willing to prove that claim by the radical offering of our life up to Christ. This is the message of James' letter: if you say you believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, then prove it by your behavior for Christ and like Christ!

# Operation Christmas Child - 2024 Quick Facts

## DISCIPLESHIP:

- The Greatest Journey is a follow-up discipleship experience offered through local churches to many of the children who receive shoebox gifts. The 12-lesson program introduces boys and girls to salvation through faith in Jesus and encourages them to grow as faithful followers.
- Over the past 30 years (since 1993), more than 50 million children have been discipled, including 25 million children who have prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior!
- Shoebox to Bible: After a child completes the 12-weeks discipleship program, a New Testament Bible is given to each child in their language. So far, over 36 million New Testaments have been given to graduates through our local church partners.
- Samaritan's Purse trains over **240,500+ volunteer teachers** to lead children through The Greatest Journey program.
- In 2023, The Greatest Journey discipleship program was translated in 91 languages and reached 98 countries!
- In 2023, over 5.1 million children participated in The Greatest Journey discipleship program and there were nearly 2.9 million decisions for Christ, equating to 331 children coming to faith each hour!
- Pray for over 5.5 million children to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program in 2024!

# **Christian Education Opportunities**

### Koinonia

The Koinonia class is a seminar-based gathering that is presently focused on an introduction to the New Testament (its formation, history, background, and content). It spends some time on the individual books but at this point doesn't make an in-depth study of a particular one. In the past, the class has studied the history of the Church and a long-term study of the book of Acts. This coming year the focus will be on the writings of Paul, other letters, and the book of Revelation. The first gatherings will consist of a review of covered material. Participants can join the class in the Parlor or via Zoom.

Resources include video lectures from Dr. Dale Martin of Yale University and presentation slides. The style is a relaxed one with much attention paid to questions, concerns, and insights of those involved.

### **Digging Deeper**

There are two important ways we immerse ourselves in the Word of God. One way is through the sermon during our gathered times of worship. The other is through personal and corporate Bible Study. To this end, and in addition to the other Sunday school classes we offer, Pastor Steve leads this study as we dig deeper into the Bible passage for next week's sermon. We gather on Monday mornings at 10 AM in the Library.
