FAITH THAT WORKS: Spiritual Sobriety James 1:9-12

Clarity Amid the Cloudiness of Life

Hopefully you had a clear view of the eclipse last week. Sadly, I did not. Just a few minutes before the peak of the eclipse, a giant cloud blocked my view.

The cloudiness of life is not limited just to the physical circumstances of life, like poverty, illness, oppression, or violence. Cloudiness in our lives can come in the form of emotional brokenness, depression, a distorted self-image, or deep-seated insecurities. Cloudiness in our lives is anything that shrouds our ability to know God, to glorify God, and to enjoy God forever.

When the circumstances or the perceptions of our life are clouded, we desperately need clarity to build our confidence and to guide our steps through life. Proverbs 3:5-6 remind us to "*Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight.*" Or as John 20:31 tells and assures us, "*These are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.*"

A Summary of the Message of James

The letter of James summarizes the most important lessons for believer's in the Lord Jesus Christ to live out during our earthly lives.

"Together Paul and James give the full dimension of faith. Paul wrote about inner saving faith from God's perspective. James wrote about outward serving faith from man's perspective. The true seed of saving faith is verified by the tangible fruit of serving faith." (James Ronald Blue)

FAITH THAT WORKS: Spiritual Sobriety

A Charge to Believers in Humble Circumstances (v. 9)

James is not speaking mainly about poverty and wealth when he refers to those who are rich or in humble circumstances. Rather, James speaks to the effect having or not having wealth has on us. Ultimately, as those who are in Christ grow in their walk with Christ, their grip on earthly things will loosen and their grip on heavenly things will tighten.

The challenge for those in humble circumstances is not finding their identity in their lack, obsessing over getting wealth, or envying those with more. Those in humble circumstances can wrestle with an overly low view of self and of one's value. Such near-sightedness shrouds one's ability to seek after, to see and savor God's goodness in this life.

A Charge to Believers in High Circumstances (10-11)

The challenge to those who are in high circumstances ("rich") is not finding their identity in their abundance, fixating on having and protecting wealth, or proudly presuming they are more important than others. Those in high circumstances can wrestle with an overly high view of self and of one's value. Again, such near-sightedness shrouds one's ability to seek after, to see and savor God's goodness in the life to come.

The Lasting Blessing to Those Who Love God (v. 12)

"Blessed" (v. 12) = "Consider it pure joy" (v. 2)

Being fully certain of God's faithfulness enables the believer to...

- 1. Persevere under trials (v. 2-4)
- 2. Walk wisely amid trials (v. 5-8)
- 3. Hold tightly to God through trials (v. 9-11)

A Counter-Cultural Community

The church is to be a countercultural community, who neither embraces nor copies the passions, priorities, and pursuits of the world, but the passions, priorities, and pursuits of the Kingdom of God, over which Christ reigns as King and rules as Lord.

Look up and read Acts 2:42-47 and Acts 4:32-35 as two important examples of the church as a counter-cultural community.

Operation Christmas Child – 2024 Quick Facts

DISCIPLESHIP:

- The Greatest Journey is a follow-up discipleship experience offered through local churches to many of the children who receive shoebox gifts. The 12-lesson program introduces boys and girls to salvation through faith in Jesus and encourages them to grow as faithful followers.
- Over the past 30 years (since 1993), more than 50 million children have been discipled, including 25 million children who have prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior!
- Shoebox to Bible: After a child completes the 12-weeks discipleship program, a New Testament Bible is given to each child in their language. So far, over 36 million New Testaments have been given to graduates through our local church partners.
- Samaritan's Purse trains over **240,500+ volunteer teachers** to lead children through The Greatest Journey program.
- In 2023, The Greatest Journey discipleship program was translated in 91 languages and reached 98 countries!
- In 2023, over **5.1 million children** participated in **The Greatest Journey** discipleship program and there were **nearly 2.9 million decisions for Christ**, equating to 331 children coming to faith each hour!
- Pray for over **5.5 million children** to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program in 2024!

Christian Education Opportunities

<u>Koinonia</u>

The Koinonia class is a seminar-based gathering that is presently focused on an introduction to the New Testament (its formation,

history, background, and content). It spends some time on the individual books but at this point doesn't make an in-depth study of a particular one. In the past, the class has studied the history of the Church and a long-term study of the book of Acts. This coming year the focus will be on the writings of Paul, other letters, and the book of Revelation. The first gatherings will consist of a review of covered material. Participants can join the class in the Parlor or via Zoom.

Resources include video lectures from Dr. Dale Martin of Yale University and presentation slides. The style is a relaxed one with much attention paid to questions, concerns, and insights of those involved.

Digging Deeper

There are two important ways we immerse ourselves in the Word of God. One way is through the sermon during our gathered times of worship. The other is through personal and corporate Bible Study. To this end, and in addition to the other Sunday school classes we offer, Pastor Steve leads this study as we dig deeper into the Bible passage for next week's sermon.
