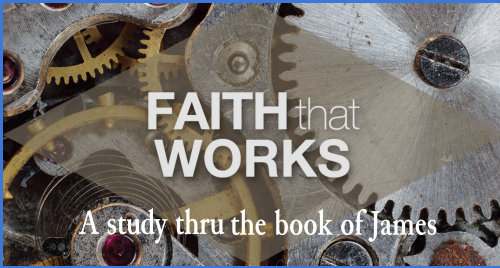

FAITH THAT WORKS: The Giver of All Good Things *James 1:13-18*

A Summary of James Thus Far

Earthly trials are designed to build our heavenly trust (v. 1-4).

Seeking God's wisdom will strengthen our assurance of God's constant and perfect care (v. 5-8).

Our perspective on life must be shaped by the grace of God to such an extent that our grip on earthly things is loosened as our grip on heavenly things is tightened (v. 9-12).

The Butterfly's Burden

While watching a butterfly struggling to emerge from its cocoon, a child took pity on its plight. So they helped the butterfly by pulling some of the cocoon apart. As the child continued to watch the butterfly, now free from its cocoon, it simply stayed on the ground, slowly moving its wings back and forth. In the end, the butterfly never moved from that spot and eventually died.

What the child didn't understand was that the butterfly's struggle was the necessary trial it needed to strengthen its wings for it to fly and live. In the same way, the struggles we face serve to strengthen us through this life and so fit us for the life to come.

God’s goodness saves — v. 18

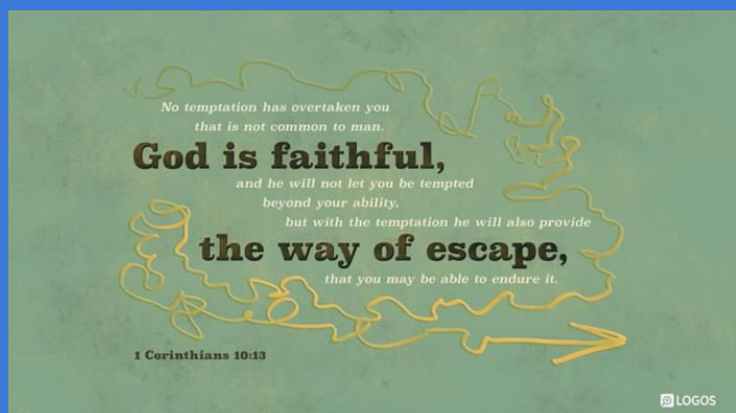
Who Answers the Door

Not only does God promise a blessing to us as we endure trials (v. 1-11), but God also promises a blessing to us as we flee temptations. That blessing is the powerful promise stated in verse 12...

“Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him.”

A Sunday School child explained this whole matter in simple terms. “Two people live in my heart: the old me and Jesus. When temptation knocks at the door, somebody has to answer. If I let the old me answer, I will sin; so I send Jesus to answer. He always wins!”

Always answer knock of temptation with Jesus, with your sure trust in Christ to satisfy beyond any comparison. In effect, look temptation in the eye and say, “No thank you, Jesus is enough!”

Operation Christmas Child – 2024 Quick Facts

DISCIPLESHIP:

- **The Greatest Journey** is a follow-up discipleship experience offered through local churches to many of the children who receive shoebox gifts. The **12-lesson program** introduces boys and girls to salvation through faith in Jesus and encourages them to grow as faithful followers.
- Over the past 30 years (since 1993), **more than 50 million children** have been discipled, **including 25 million children who have prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior!**
- **Shoebox to Bible:** After a child completes the 12-weeks discipleship program, a **New Testament Bible** is given to each child in their language. So far, **over 36 million New Testaments** have been given to graduates through our local church partners.
- Samaritan's Purse trains over **240,500+ volunteer teachers** to lead children through The Greatest Journey program.
- In 2023, The Greatest Journey discipleship program was translated in **91 languages** and reached **98 countries!**
- In 2023, over **5.1 million children** participated in **The Greatest Journey** discipleship program and there were **nearly 2.9 million decisions for Christ**, equating to 331 children coming to faith each hour!
- Pray for over **5.5 million children** to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program in 2024!

Christian Education Opportunities

Koinonia

The Koinonia class is a seminar-based gathering that is presently focused on an introduction to the New Testament (its formation, history, background, and content). It spends some time on the individual books but at this point doesn't make an in-depth study of a particular one. In the past, the class has studied the history of the Church and a long-term study of the book of Acts. This coming year the focus will be on the writings of Paul, other letters, and the book of Revelation. The first gatherings will consist of a review of covered material. Participants can join the class in the Parlor or via Zoom.

Resources include video lectures from Dr. Dale Martin of Yale University and presentation slides. The style is a relaxed one with much attention paid to questions, concerns, and insights of those involved.

Digging Deeper

There are two important ways we immerse ourselves in the Word of God. One way is through the sermon during our gathered times of worship. The other is through personal and corporate Bible Study. To this end, and in addition to the other Sunday school classes we offer, Pastor Steve leads this study as we dig deeper into the Bible passage for next week's sermon. We gather on Monday mornings at 10 AM in the Library.
