FAITH THAT WORKS:

The Foolishness of Favoritism

James 2:1-13

Our Ascendant Self-Centeredness

C.S. Lewis' masterful work in the opening pages of Mere Christianity where he exposes our innate belief in an absolute law and our equal commitment to "my own" absolute best interest.

Favoritism, bias, prejudice, discrimination...these are the sinful vices James confronts in the passage before us today. What we must see and understand about our favoring attitudes and actions is that favoritism is a disguised form of selfishness and self-centeredness. Whenever we do for or preferentially choose another, we do so for personal benefit. (Example: when choosing teams on a playground, rarely has a team captain selected their teammates altruistically.)

The Anathema of Favoritism

Leviticus 19:15 (Exodus 23:2-3; Deuteronomy 1:17)

"You shall do no injustice in court. You shall not be partial to the poor or defer to the great, but in righteousness shall you judge your neighbor."

Deuteronomy 16:19

"You shall not pervert justice. You shall not show partiality, and you shall not accept a bribe, for a bribe blinds the eyes of the wise and subverts the cause of the righteous."

Deuteronomy 27:19

"Cursed be anyone who perverts the justice due to the sojourner, the fatherless, and the widow. And all the people shall say, 'Amen'."

Proverbs 18:5

"It is not good to be partial to the wicked or to deprive the righteous of justice."

Proverbs 28:21

"To show partiality is not good, but for a piece of bread a man will do wrong."

Operation Christmas Child - 2024 Quick Facts

DISCIPLESHIP:

- The Greatest Journey is a follow-up discipleship experience offered through local churches to many of the children who receive shoebox gifts. The 12-lesson program introduces boys and girls to salvation through faith in Jesus and encourages them to grow as faithful followers.
- Over the past 30 years (since 1993), more than 50 million children have been discipled, including 25 million children who have prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior!
- Shoebox to Bible: After a child completes the 12-weeks discipleship program, a New Testament Bible is given to each child in their language. So far, over 36 million New Testaments have been given to graduates through our local church partners.
- Samaritan's Purse trains over **240,500+ volunteer teachers** to lead children through The Greatest Journey program.
- In 2023, The Greatest Journey discipleship program was translated in 91 languages and reached 98 countries!
- In 2023, over 5.1 million children participated in The Greatest Journey discipleship program and there were nearly 2.9 million decisions for Christ, equating to 331 children coming to faith each hour!
- Pray for over 5.5 million children to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program in 2024!

Christian Education Opportunities

Koinonia

The Koinonia class is a seminar-based gathering that is presently focused on an introduction to the New Testament (its formation, history, background, and content). It spends some time on the individual books but at this point doesn't make an in-depth study of a particular one. In the past, the class has studied the history of the Church and a long-term study of the book of Acts. This coming year the focus will be on the writings of Paul, other letters, and the book of Revelation. The first gatherings will consist of a review of covered material. Participants can join the class in the Parlor or via Zoom.

Resources include video lectures from Dr. Dale Martin of Yale University and presentation slides. The style is a relaxed one with much attention paid to questions, concerns, and insights of those involved.

Digging Deeper

There are two important ways we immerse ourselves in the Word of God. One way is through the sermon during our gathered times of worship. The other is through personal and corporate Bible Study. To this end, and in addition to the other Sunday school classes we offer, Pastor Steve leads this study as we dig deeper into the Bible passage for next week's sermon. We gather on Monday mornings at 10 AM in the Library.
