Warring Wisdoms

James 3:13-18

A World at War

This world is at war. It's everywhere. It's in our schools, our workplaces, and our churches. It's in distant lands, it's in our neighborhoods, and it's in our homes. According to a bit of wisdom attributed to the Roman emperor, Alexander the Great, "I have met the enemy; it is I."

The Origin of Our Warring Madness

Is this just how the world has always been? Or, was there a time without this warring madness? God's Word clearly and definitively answers these questions with an unequivocal "No!" The world has not always been at war. The first three chapters of Genesis describe the origin of our warring madness.

In Genesis 3, we are told that Satan, appearing in the form of a snake, approached Eve and Adam and challenged God's clarity, truthfulness and goodness. Listen to how it is described in Genesis 3:1-7.

Questioning God's clarity — "Did God actually say...?" v. 1)

Denying God's truthfulness – "You will not certainly die!" (v. 4)

Rejecting God's goodness – "For God knows that you will be like God." (v. 5)

Freedom Demands Responsibility

This is the condition in which humanity has been living ever since. As a result of the first human's rebellion, we all live defiantly against God, rejecting God's wisdom and relying on our own wisdom. "In a world without God, human beings are not so much free as overwhelmingly responsible."

FAITH THAT WORKS: Warring Wisdom

The Conduct of True Wisdom – v. 13

Definition of Wisdom: "Wisdom is the right use of knowledge." (Charles Spurgeon) Wisdom, then, might be described as the ability to rightly apprehend, apply, and act on the truth of God as revealed in the Word of God.

In verse 13, James sets up the glaring contrast between Godly wisdom and presumptive earthly wisdom. He does so by pointing out two important practical elements about true wisdom: 1) true wisdom must be consistently acted on, and 2) true wisdom will produce virtuous fruit in our lives. These practical elements are highlighted by contrasting earthly wisdom with Godly wisdom.

The Characteristics of Earthly Wisdom – v. 14-16 Earthly wisdom originates from below, independent from God.

Earthly wisdom focuses on humans only.

Earthly wisdom manifests divisive vices: envy, self-centeredness, boasting, rejection of the truth, the demonic

Earthly wisdom produces only trouble.

The Characteristics of Godly Wisdom – v. 17-18

Godly wisdom originates from above, dependent on

Godly wisdom focuses on God supremely.

Godly wisdom manifests unifying virtues: purity, peace, kindness, cooperation, mercy, fairness, and authentic goodness.

Godly wisdom produces only blessing.

Operation Christmas Child - 2024 Quick Facts

DISCIPLESHIP:

- The Greatest Journey is a follow-up discipleship experience offered through local churches to many of the children who receive shoebox gifts. The 12-lesson program introduces boys and girls to salvation through faith in Jesus and encourages them to grow as faithful followers.
- Over the past 30 years (since 1993), more than 50 million children have been discipled, including 25 million children who have prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior!
- Shoebox to Bible: After a child completes the 12-weeks discipleship program, a New Testament Bible is given to each child in their language. So far, over 36 million New Testaments have been given to graduates through our local church partners.
- Samaritan's Purse trains over **240,500+ volunteer teachers** to lead children through The Greatest Journey program.
- In 2023, The Greatest Journey discipleship program was translated in 91 languages and reached 98 countries!
- In 2023, over 5.1 million children participated in The Greatest Journey discipleship program and there were nearly 2.9 million decisions for Christ, equating to 331 children coming to faith each hour!
- Pray for over 5.5 million children to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program in 2024!
