

The Spectrum of God's Grace

James 4:1-12

Dealing with Division in the Church

In almost every New Testament letter from Acts thru Revelation, at some point in those letters, quarrels, fights, division, and conflict is described and dealt with.

During the time of the New Testament, when letters were sent to various churches, they would be delivered and read aloud in the congregation by a close companion of the author. Considering some of the challenging and confrontational content in may of the New Testament letters, it must have been an interesting experience to hear and process the content of these letters as God's people. It would be especially uncomfortable (or maybe a relief) to hear the church's "dirty laundry" aired in these letters.

As we consider this passage in James, wouldn't you love to know what was going on in this church that James would think it necessary to address it so directly?

FAITH THAT WORKS: The Spectrum of God's Grace

The Absence of God's Grace – v. 1-3

What causes problems among God's people? James puts it plainly: uncontrolled desires (v. 1), unfulfilled appetites (v. 2), & unfaithful motives (v. 3).

We have a fatal heart condition (sin) that can only be cured by a radical heart transplant. And the Lord Jesus Christ is the heart donor.

The Power of God's Grace – v. 4-6

All of us are naturally aligned with the world and enemies of God (v. 4).

And yet, there remains in us a longing for our heart's true home in God, even as God has not quit on us (v. 5).

Our rescue by God, our restored relationship with God, and renewed life for God is all of grace! (v. 6)

Grace is God's unearned, undeserved goodness shown to us in Christ. Or, grace is God's Riches At Christ's Expense!

The Work of God's Grace – v. 7-10

With reverence for God (humility), we must revere and rejoice in God (submission), and resist the enemy of our soul, the devil (v. 7).

The antidote to quarrels and divisions among God's people is our ongoing renewal in the grace of God (v. 8-10). We need to be regularly reminded of the grace of God shown to us in the Lord Jesus Christ. In this way we will renew our dependence on God and determination to seek first God's Kingdom (Matthew 6:33). We will grieve our tendency to sin, even as we glory in the joy of the Lord. In this way, humility before God and one another is the basis of our whole life.

The Fruit of God's Grace – v. 11-12

James returns to the cause and consequences of conflict in the church: our sinful pride and our careless words. By our words, we exert power and domination over one another. But by God's Word, we exhibit humility and graciousness to one another.



Operation Christmas Child - 2024 Quick Facts

DISCIPLESHIP:

- The Greatest Journey is a follow-up discipleship experience offered through local churches to many of the children who receive shoebox gifts. The 12-lesson program introduces boys and girls to salvation through faith in Jesus and encourages them to grow as faithful followers.
- Over the past 30 years (since 1993), more than 50 million children have been discipled, including 25 million children who have prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior!
- Shoebox to Bible: After a child completes the 12-weeks discipleship program, a New Testament Bible is given to each child in their language. So far, over 36 million New Testaments have been given to graduates through our local church partners.
- Samaritan's Purse trains over **240,500+ volunteer teachers** to lead children through The Greatest Journey program.
- In 2023, The Greatest Journey discipleship program was translated in 91 languages and reached 98 countries!
- In 2023, over 5.1 million children participated in The Greatest Journey discipleship program and there were nearly 2.9 million decisions for Christ, equating to 331 children coming to faith each hour!
- Pray for over 5.5 million children to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program in 2024!
