

The Typical Approach to Life

The typical approach to life in the Western world, and especially in America, goes like this:

We commit to varied responsibilities and obligations: a unique friend group, specific schools, a particular vocation, etc.

Divergent Principles of Life

<u>The Self-Centered Life</u> – Life's purpose and joy is lost as it is primarily sought in the self-centered pursuit of worldly pleasures.

<u>The Savior-Centered Life</u> – Life's purpose and joy is found as it is primarily sought in the Savior-centered pursuit of heavenly pleasures.

FAITH THAT WORKS: Savoring the Sovereignty of God

Leaving God Out of Our Plans (v. 13)

James quotes what was likely a commonplace saying in his day; and no doubt a commonplace approach to life in our day.

The essence of this approach to life is planning and purposing without God, relying on and revolving one's life around our wants, our will, our works, and our worth.

The Transience of Life (v. 14)

The book of Ecclesiastes explores the depths of life's emptiness when lived untethered God. James summarizes this transience in just one verse. While we plan and boast about big project and accomplishments to come, we are powerless to guarantee we will even have a tomorrow.

Living Under Christ's Lordship (v. 15)

Rather than proudly organizing our life around and for ourselves, the wiser approach to life is to invite God in and yield to God's sovereign will. This approach to life is humbly embracing of God's will and submissively lives under God's will.

The Danger of a Godless Life (v. 16-17)

James returns to the root of our arrogant ambivalence to God. We proudly boasting of our achievements without any acknowledgment of God's gracious goodness that brings about those very achievements. This manifest a deep seated ignorance of God and how the world operates under God's authority.

An Abiding Awareness of God's Active Presence

Contrary to such rebellious pride and arrogance, we must instead embrace an approach to life that is abidingly aware of God's active presence. As an aid to embracing this approach to life, I invite you to look up, ponder, and let the Holy Spirit apply to your life the following Bible passages.

Operation Christmas Child - 2024 Quick Facts

DISCIPLESHIP:

- The Greatest Journey is a follow-up discipleship experience offered through local churches to many of the children who receive shoebox gifts. The 12-lesson program introduces boys and girls to salvation through faith in Jesus and encourages them to grow as faithful followers.
- Over the past 30 years (since 1993), more than 50 million children have been discipled, including 25 million children who have prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior!
- Shoebox to Bible: After a child completes the 12-weeks discipleship program, a New Testament Bible is given to each child in their language. So far, over 36 million New Testaments have been given to graduates through our local church partners.
- Samaritan's Purse trains over **240,500+ volunteer teachers** to lead children through The Greatest Journey program.
- In 2023, The Greatest Journey discipleship program was translated in 91 languages and reached 98 countries!
- In 2023, over 5.1 million children participated in The Greatest Journey discipleship program and there were nearly 2.9 million decisions for Christ, equating to 331 children coming to faith each hour!
- Pray for over 5.5 million children to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program in 2024!
