Fruits Above, Roots Below

Faith in Christ that does not grow into Christ's likeness is not genuine faith. And growth that is not rooted in Christ is shallow and unsustainable.

Roots and Fruits

Rooted in Christ through His Word

To be rooted in Christ is to be anchored in Him and nourished by Him. Paul writes, "As you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith." (Colossians 2:6-7) Roots both hold a tree steady amid the storms and draw life-giving nutrients from the soil. So too with us: Christ is the soil in which we are immovably planted, and His Word is the living water nourishing and sustaining our life.

Every follower of Christ must be intentionally rooted. That means daily seeking Him in Scripture and prayer. And it means participating regularly in study with others, because roots do not grow by accident, but grow only when we intentionally plant ourselves in Christ and His Word. But roots are never meant to remain hidden underground or behind our private lives. Rather, they exist to fuel growth. So let's look at how such growth takes place in us as the body of Christ.

Growing in Christ Together through His Word

Roots are not the end; they exist for growth. Jeremiah tells us that the one who trusts in the Lord is like a tree planted by water, whose leaves remain green and who never ceases to bear fruit. Growth is the evidence of life.

Notice also that growth happens best together. Paul says in Colossians 3:16, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom." Ephesians 4:15-16 pictures the church body growing up into Christ the Head, "as each part does its work." Our growth is not merely individual but communal.

Bearing Fruit for Christ by Abiding in His Word The purpose of roots and growth is always fruit. Jesus said, "Whoever remains in me and I in them, they will produce much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing." (John 15:4-5) Fruit is the visible evidence of the invisible life of Christ flowing through us.

What is this fruit? It is the fruit of the Spirit — love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control (Gal. 5:22–23). It is the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ (Phil. 1:11). It is the fruit of good works and faithful witness (Titus 3:14). But be warned. Jesus cursed the fig tree that bore no fruit (Matt. 21:19). He told of a barren tree that, unless it bore fruit, would be cut down (Luke 13:6-9). Faith without fruit is dead.

Now Is the Time to Grow

Church family, the truth is clear: we cannot thrive as disciples of Jesus on shallow roots or spotty nourishment. A tree with no roots withers. A faith with no depth in Christ collapses. And a disciple who does not feed on the Word of God — both privately and with the people of God — never grows into maturity, and will never bear fruit that lasts.

Rally Day is not just a date on the calendar. It is a decisive moment when we declare: "I will be rooted in Christ. I will grow in Him. I will bear fruit for His glory. I will be a beacon of Christ's light in this sin darkened world." If we want lasting fruit in our lives and in His church, we must choose daily to be rooted in Christ's Word together.

Will you step in, or will you remain on the edges of discipleship? This is God's invitation: don't stand on the edges of discipleship. Step in. Take hold. Commit yourself this year to study God's Word — not only in your personal time, but also in the fellowship of God's people. Choose a class. Join a group. Make it a priority. Your spiritual health, the fruitfulness of your life, and the witness of this church depend on it.
