Where might God be calling you to align your will with His?

Yield your plans to God’s greater purpose.

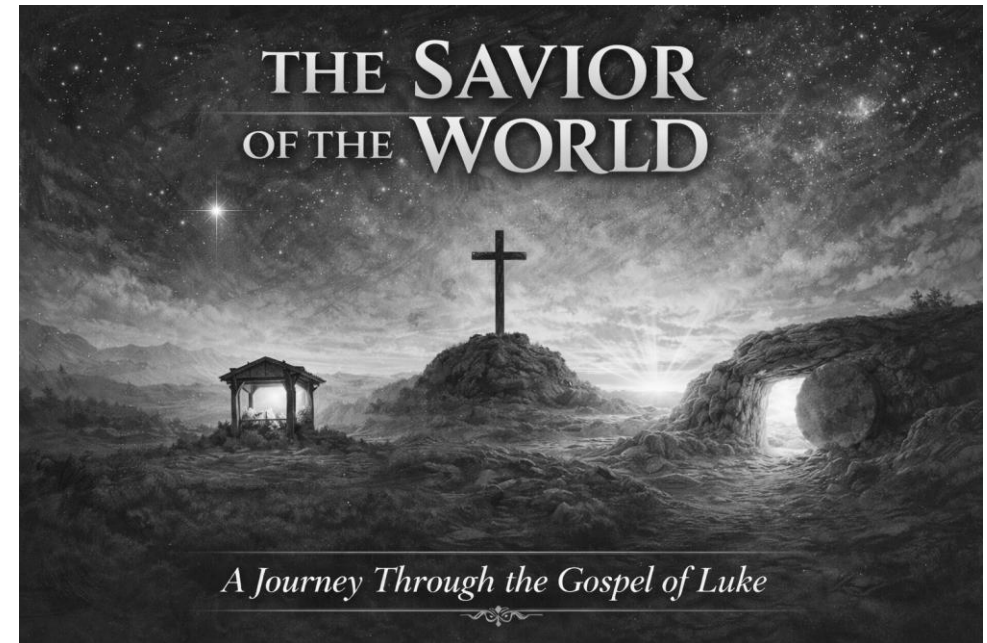
Day 5: Growing in Grace

Read and Reflect: Luke 2:51-52; Colossians 1:9-12

Growth takes time.

What areas of life show slow but steady transformation by grace?

Thank God for His patient sanctifying work, and ask Him to grow you in His wisdom and favor today.

SERMON NOTES

1. *Devotion - The Customary Celebration of the Passover (v. 41-42)*
Jesus was raised in a home of habitual faithfulness and worship.
Faithfulness often looks like repeatedly doing the same obedient thing without recognition.
The true Redeemer attended the redemption feast.

→ Faith grows through rhythms of obedience, not moments of novelty.
2. *Loss – Separation, Search, and Stress (v. 43-45)*
Mary and Joseph’s panic was real, yet Jesus was never lost to God.
Sometimes the Lord feels absent, not because He’s gone, but because He’s doing what we do not yet understand.

→ Our confusion does not mean God is absent.
3. *Amazement – Learning and Revealing (v. 46-47)*
The boy Jesus humbly listened and asked questions.
The Son of God submitted to learning under the Word He gave.

→ True wisdom grows through humble dependence on God’s Word.
4. *Clarification – Distress and Distinction (v. 48-50)*
Mary’s honest distress met Jesus’ calm reorientation:
“Did you not know that I must be in My Father’s house?”
Jesus’ life is governed by divine necessity—the “must” that leads to the cross.

→ God’s plan is often clearer than our understanding of it.
5. *Submission – Return, Reverence, and Readiness (v. 51-52)*
Jesus returned to Nazareth and lived in ordinary obedience.
Growth—intellectual, physical, relational, spiritual—unfolded under the Father’s favor.

→ Holiness happens through daily faithfulness in the ordinary.

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL GUIDE

Day 1: Faithfulness in the Ordinary

Read and Reflect: Luke 2:41–42; Deuteronomy 6:4–9

God shapes us through repetition, not recognition.

How do your daily rhythms form your faith?

Ask for grace to find joy in quiet, consistent obedience.

Day 2: When God Seems Absent

Read and Reflect: Luke 2:43-45; Psalm 13

Mary and Joseph feared Jesus was lost.

Have you felt that way spiritually?

How does Psalm 13 model honest prayer amid confusion?

Bring your uncertainty to the Lord and ask for patient trust.

Day 3: The Wisdom of Listening

Read and Reflect: Luke 2:46-47; Proverbs 2:1-6

Jesus, though divine, listened and asked questions.

What does this teach about humility and learning?

Ask the Holy Spirit to give you a teachable heart before God’s Word.
