2. QUALIFIED
CHARITABLE
DISTRIBUTIONS (QCDs)

If you are **age 70½ or older**, you may be eligible to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution directly from an IRA to Trinity.

A QCD is a distribution made directly from an IRA to a qualified charitable organization. When the requirements are met, the QCD can be excluded from taxable income and can count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD), subject to applicable rules, however it can not count as a charitable deduction.

For **2026**, the annual QCD limit is **\$111,000 per individual**. The limit is subject to annual adjustment.

A QCD must be made **directly from the IRA trustee or administrator to the charity**; it should not first be made payable to or received by the donor.

If you are considering a QCD, contact your IRA administrator and tax advisor. Trinity's church office can provide the information needed to direct the gift to the church.

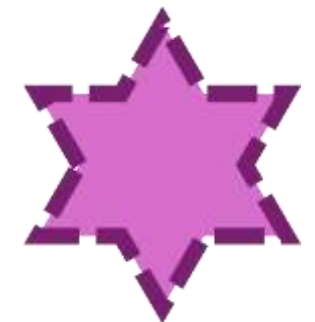


Shining Star Center

Children of all ages, please visit the Shining Star Center in the Narthex. The area includes Sunday activity sheets, crayons/colored pencils and squishys/stress balls.
